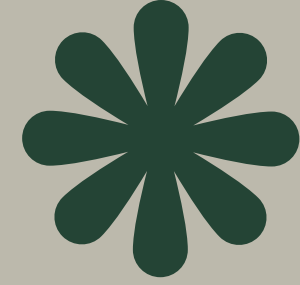

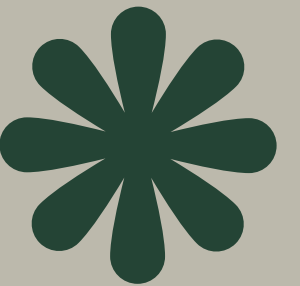

ALLEPPEY (Alappuzha)



Alleppey (officially Alappuzha) is a scenic city in Kerala, India renowned as the "Venice of the East" for its vast network of interconnected canals, backwaters and houseboats. As a premier tourist destination, it offers relaxing houseboat cruises, the historic Alleppey Lighthouse and the famous annual Nehru Trophy Boat Race in August.

ALLEPPEY BACKWATERS

Alleppey backwaters are an interconnected network of over 900 km of lagoons, lakes, rivers and canals running parallel to the Arabian Sea in Kerala known as the "Venice of the East". They offer a unique ecosystem where villagers rely on waterways for transportation, and tourists explore the palm-fringed scenery via houseboats and traditional boats.

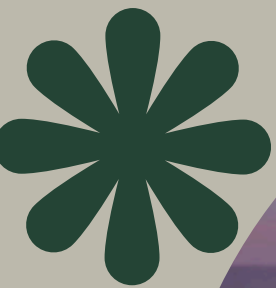
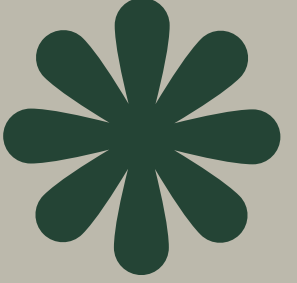


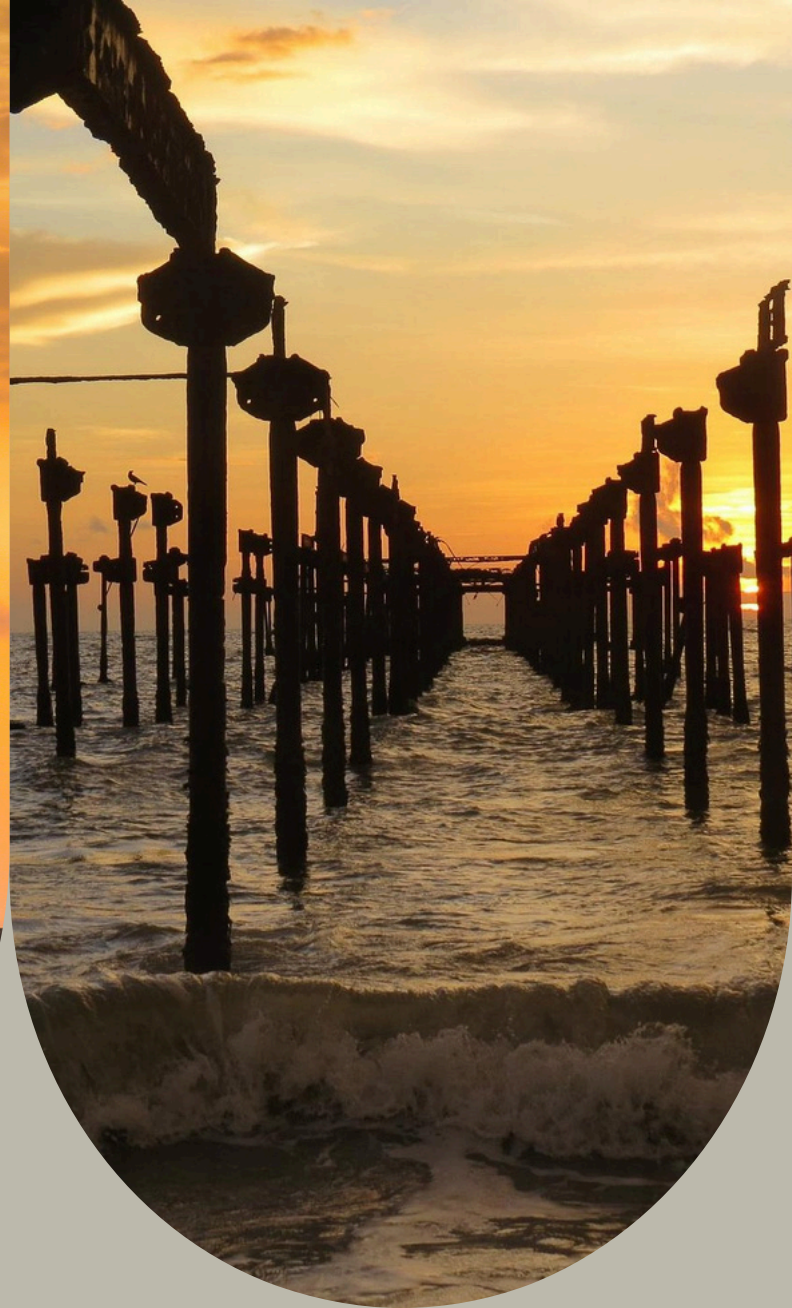
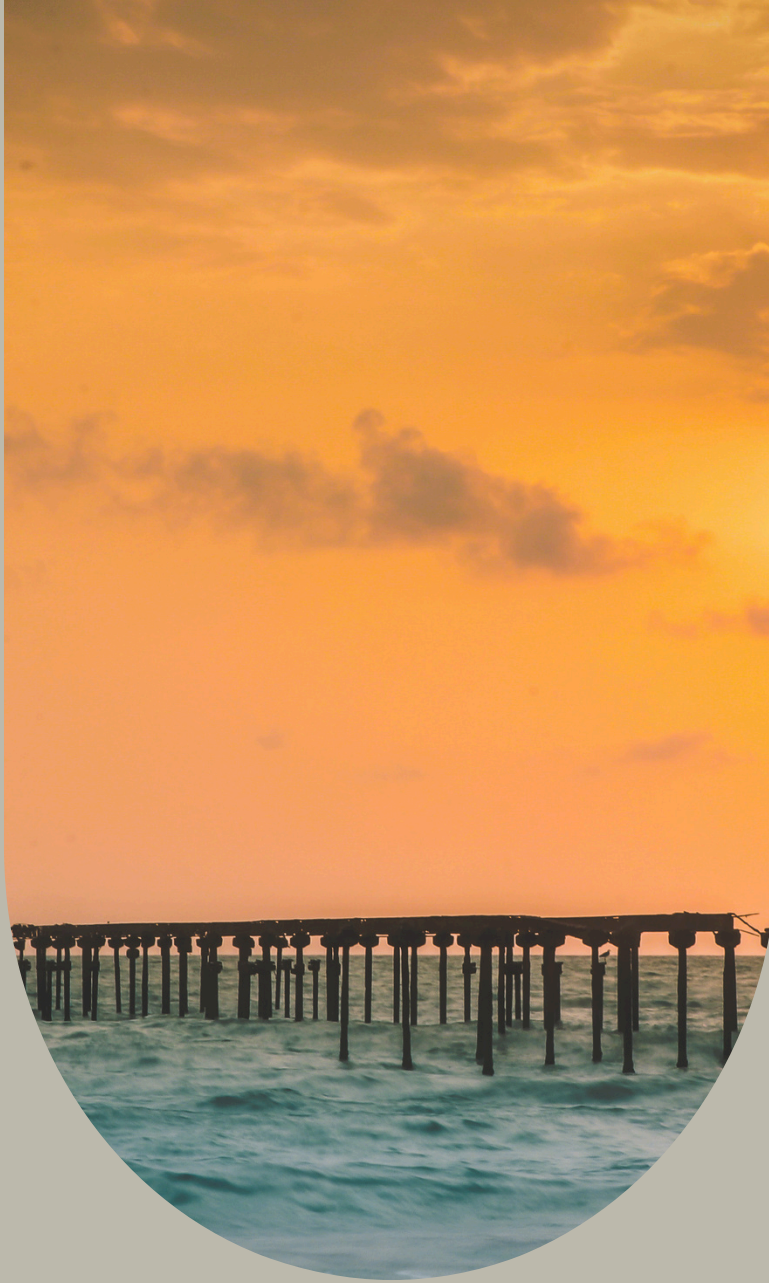
PATHIRAMANAL ISLAND

Pathiramanal which translates to "Sands of Night" is a 10-acre island located in the Vembanad Lake in the Alappuzha district of Kerala, India. Known as a tranquil uninhabited oasis, it is a popular destination for nature lovers, birdwatchers and travelers taking backwater cruises between Alappuzha and Kumarakom.

SEMBANAD LAKE

Vembanad Lake, located in Alleppey (Alappuzha) is the longest lake in India and the largest in the state of Kerala, stretching over 96.5 km in length. It serves as the heart of Kerala's backwater tourism and is a major ecological resource.





ALAPPUZHA BEACH

Alappuzha Beach known as the "Venice of the East" is a popular Kerala destination famous for its 150-year-old pier, lighthouse and serene Arabian Sea views. Located in Alleppey, it offers a scenic escape with white sands, a children's park and nearby houseboat backwater cruises.

MARARI BEACH

Marari Beach located in the Alappuzha district of Kerala, India is a serene relatively untouched destination renowned for its peaceful atmosphere, golden sands and swaying coconut palms. Unlike more commercialized beaches, Marari offers a quiet "sleepy" fishing village vibe, making it an ideal escape for relaxation, rejuvenation and experiencing traditional Kerala life.



THOTTAPPALLY BEACH

Thottappally Beach is a serene, offbeat destination located about 20 km from Alappuzha (Alleppey) in Kerala. Known for its unique black sand (due to high mineral content like zircon) and its active fishing harbour, it offers a quieter alternative to the more commercial beaches in the region.



ANDHAKARANAZHI BEACH

Andhakaranazhi Beach is a serene relatively untouched coastal destination located in the Alappuzha district of Kerala, India. Known as a "lagoon of darkness," it is a picturesque spot where backwaters meet the Arabian Sea, making it a popular, tranquil getaway for both domestic and international tourists.

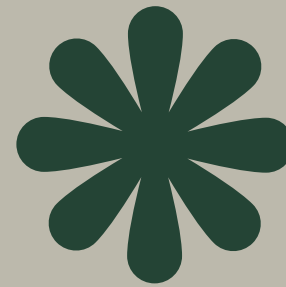
PUNAPRA BEACH

Punnapra Beach is a serene secluded and pristine coastal destination located in the village of Punnapra approximately 8-10 km south of Alappuzha (Alleppey) town in Kerala, India. Known for its quiet atmosphere it serves as a peaceful alternative to the more crowded tourist beaches in the area offering a glimpse into authentic coastal life, characterized by traditional fishing boats and a lush, tree-lined coast.





ALAPPUZHA LIGHTHOUSE & MUSEUM



The Alappuzha Lighthouse also known as the Alleppey Light is a historic maritime beacon in Alappuzha, Kerala, built in 1862. It is one of the oldest lighthouses on the southwest coast of India and features a distinctive 28-meter tall cylindrical tower with red and white horizontal stripes.



AMBALAPUZHA SREE KRISHNA TEMPLE

The Ambalapuzha Sree Krishna Swamy Temple is a historic 15th-century Hindu temple in Kerala's Alappuzha district renowned for its Kerala-style architecture and the deity Lord Krishna in his Parthasarathi (charioteer) form. It is most famous for its sweet milk porridge offering, Ambalapuzha Palpayasam, and for being the birthplace of the art form Ottanthullal.

ST. ANDREW'S BASILICA (ARTHUNKAL CHURCH)

St. Andrew's Basilica commonly known as Arthunkal Church is one of the most prominent pilgrimage centres in Kerala and the largest shrine of St. Sebastian in the world. Located in the coastal village of Arthunkal in Alappuzha, it is a significant symbol of religious harmony where devotees of all faiths congregate.

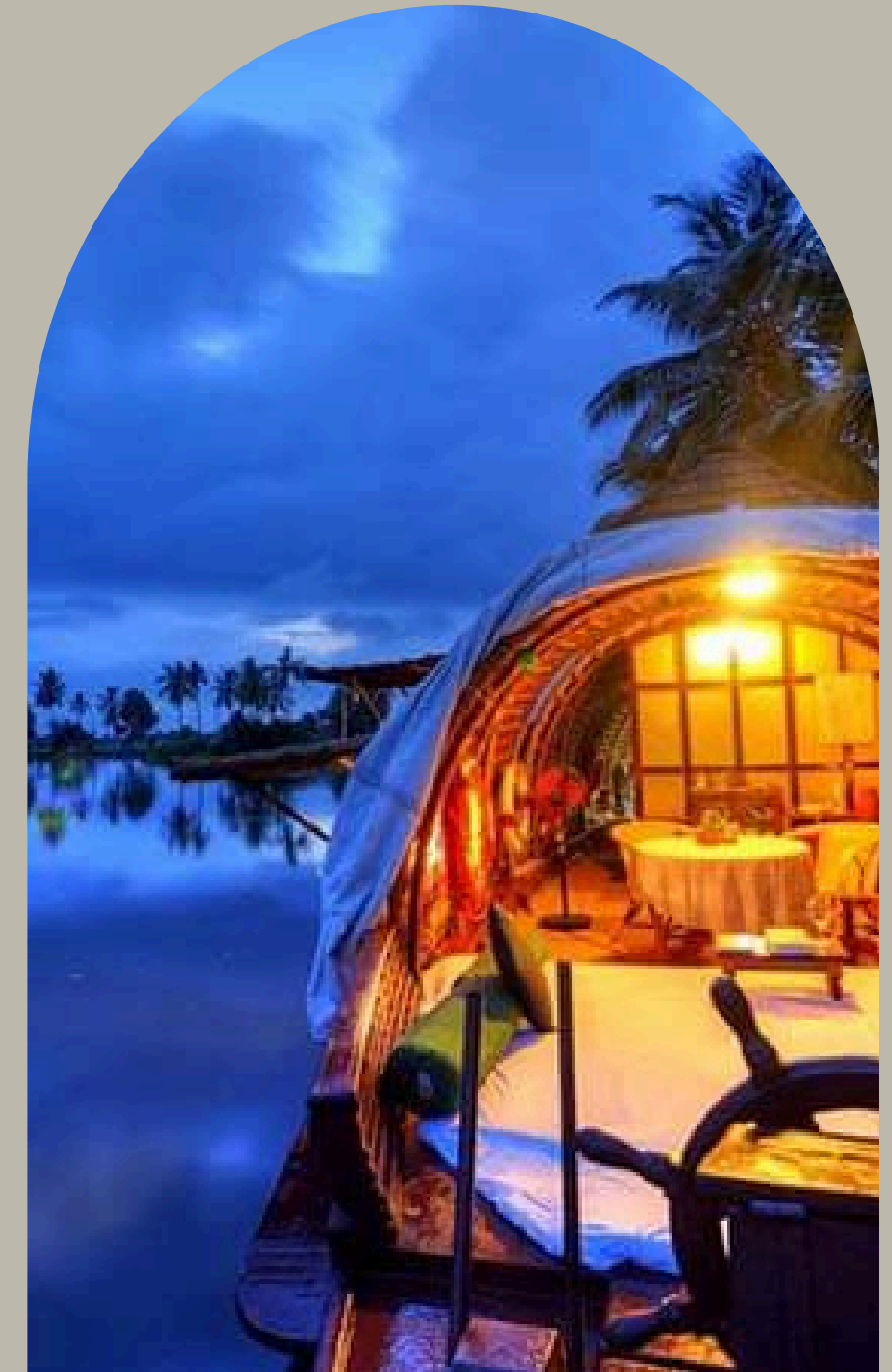


MULLAKKAL RAJA RAJESWARI TEMPLE

The Mullakkal Raja Rajeswari Temple also known as the Mullakkal Bhagavathy Temple is a renowned Hindu shrine located in the heart of Alleppey (Alappuzha) town Kerala, India. Dedicated to Goddess Durga, it is popular for its unique architecture and the 41-day [Mullakkal Chirappu festival].
