DAWKI

Dawki is a picturesque border town located in the West Jaintia Hills district of Meghalaya, India. Famous for its stunning, crystal clear water, it has become a major tourist attraction in Northeast India. It is primarily known for the Umngot River. Which runs through the town and acts as a natural boundary between the Jaintia Hills and the Khasi Hills.

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UMNGOT RIVER (DAWKI RIVER)

The Umngot River, popularly known as the Dawki River is a pristine waterway located in the West Jaintia Hills district of Meghalaya, India. Renowned as one of the cleanest rivers in Asia, it is famous for its crystal-clear, transparent water, which creates a mesmerizing, surreal illusion of boats floating on air.

DAWKI SUSPENSION BRIDGE

The Dawki Suspension Bridge is a historic single lane bridge located in Dawki, Meghalaya, serving as a vital link over the crystal clear Umngot River near the India-Bangladesh border. Built in 1932 by British authorities, it is a prominent landmark renowned for its colonial-era engineering and scenic views.



SHNONGPDENG VILLAGE

Shnongpdeng is a serene scenic village located in the Jaintia Hills of Meghalaya, India, renowned for its crystal-clear water and status as a rising eco-tourism destination. Situated along the banks of the Umngot River often described as one of India's cleanest rivers it is roughly 8-10 km from the border town of Dawki.





MAWLYNNONG VILLAGE

Mawlynnong located in Meghalaya's East Khasi Hills is renowned as "Asia's Cleanest Village" and "God's Own Garden". Famous for 100% literacy, exceptional community led sanitation and eco-tourism, this village features pristine streets, living root bridges and a 100-year-old church. It offers a sustainable, scenic getaway near the Bangladesh border.



MAWLYNNONG WATERFALLS



Mawlynnong Waterfall is a picturesque natural attraction located in the East Khasi Hills district of Meghalaya, specifically near Mawlynnong Village, widely known as "Asia's Cleanest Village". The waterfall is surrounded by dense verdant greenery and is part of a community-based eco-tourism initiative.

RIWAI LIVING ROOT BRIDGE



The Riwai Living Root Bridge, often called the Nohwet Living Root Bridge is a remarkable natural wonder located in the Riwai Village near Mawlynnong in the East Khasi Hills of Meghalaya, India. It is one of the most accessible living root bridges in the state and is a prime example of the sustainable eco-friendly engineering practiced by the local Khasi people.



BALANCING ROCK

The Balancing Rock, locally known as Maw Ryngkew Sharatia is a fascinating natural attraction located near Mawlynnong Village in the East Khasi Hills district of Meghalaya, India. While often associated with the nearby town of Dawki (approximately 35 km away), the rock is a key attraction in the Mawlynnong region, often referred to as "Asia's Cleanest Village".



DARRANG VILLAGE

Darrang is a serene riverside village in Meghalaya's West Jaintia Hills, near Dawki (6 km) and Shnongpdeng (3 km). Situated on the Umngot River, it is a popular eco-tourism spot for camping, kayaking, snorkeling, and cliff jumping. It offers a quiet, less crowded alternative to neighboring spots.



BORHILLS FALLS

Borhill Falls (also spelled Bophill Falls) is a stunning lesser-known, multi-tiered waterfall located in the West Jaintia Hills district of Meghalaya, India. It is situated near the Indo-Bangladesh border between the towns of Dawki and Lyngkhat, making it a popular detour for tourists exploring that region.



TAMABIL BORDER CROSSING

The Tamabil border crossing, often referred to as the Dawki Tamabil border is a key international border checkpoint connecting India and Bangladesh. Located in the Jaintia Hills of Meghalaya, India and the Sylhet Division of Bangladesh, it serves as both a significant trade route and a popular tourist passage.
