# DIMAPUR

Dimapur is the largest city, 1st most populous district and primary commercial hub of Nagaland acting as the state's main gateway. Located along the Dhansiri River, it is known as the former capital of the medieval Dimasa Kachari Kingdom. It is also the only city in Nagaland with a major airport and railway station, offering a blend of history, culture and bustling markets.

## KACHARI RUINS

The Kachari Ruins or "Rajbari," are an ancient mysterious archaeological site in Dimapur, Nagaland, featuring enigmatic mushroom shaped stone pillars erected by the Dimasa Kachari Kingdom between the 10th and 13th centuries. Located in the Supermarket area, these 8 to 10 foot pillars are considered remnants of a temple complex or fertility cult symbols, offering a glimpse into the region's pre-Ahom history.

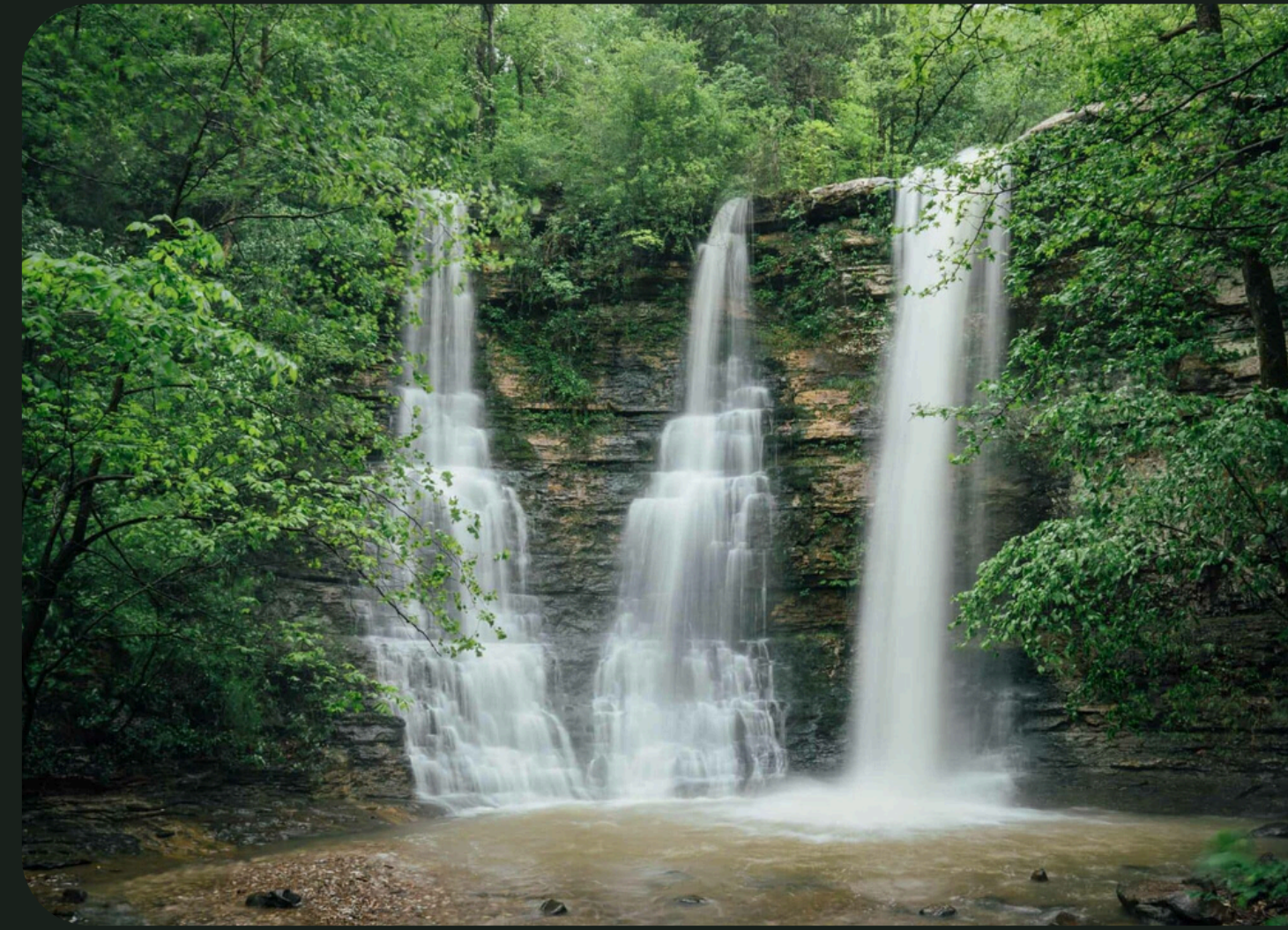


## DIMAPUR WAR CEMETERY

The Kohima War Cemetery in Nagaland, India is a serene meticulously maintained memorial established in 1946 to honor over 1,400 Allied soldiers who died during the fierce Battle of Kohima in World War II. Located on Garrison Hill, it features white gravestones, the iconic tennis court and the famous epitaph dedicated to the 2nd Division's sacrifice.

## TRIPLE FALLS

Triple Falls in Seithekima Village, Nagaland (near Dimapur) is a scenic three tiered, 280 foot waterfall cascading into a natural pool. Nestled in lush, tropical jungle, it is popular for trekking, picnics and nature photography. The site is maintained by the tourism department, offering a secluded adventure about 20 km from Dimapur.



## NAGALAND SCIENCE CENTRE

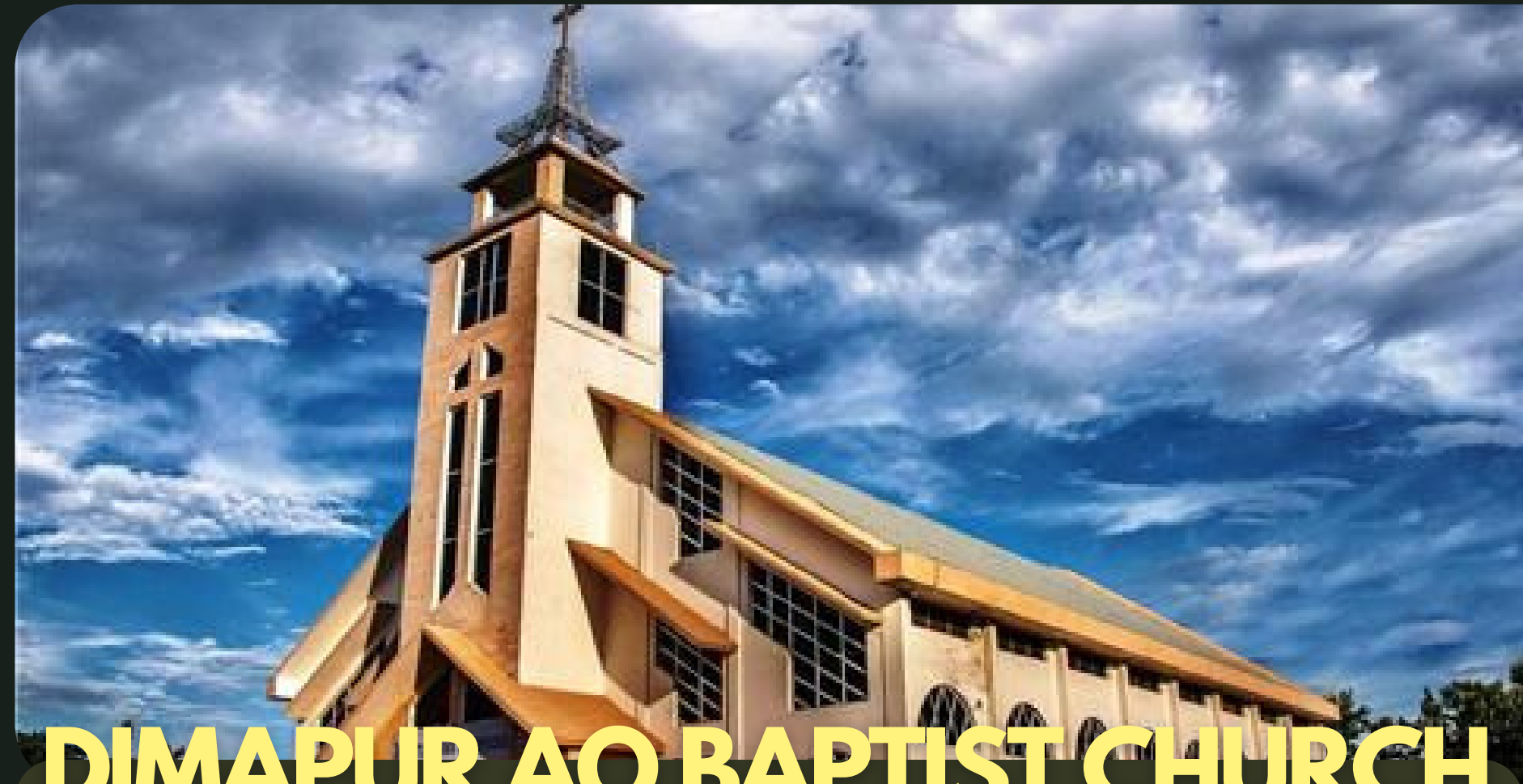
The Nagaland Science Centre in Dimapur is an interactive educational hub designed to foster scientific curiosity, featuring a science park, 3D theater, planetarium and an Innovation Hub. Open daily (except Mondays) from 10 AM to 4 PM, it offers affordable, hands on exhibits perfect for families and students to explore science principles.





## DIEZEPHE VILLAGE

Diezephe Village, located 13km from Dimapur in Chumoukedima district, Nagaland is a renowned craft and tourism hub recognized for its rich Tenyimei (Angami Naga) cultural heritage and skilled artisans. Awarded Best Tourism Village in 2023, it specializes in woodcarving, bamboo/cane products and traditional loom textiles.



## DIMAPUR AO BAPTIST CHURCH

The Dimapur Ao Baptist Arogo (DABA) is a large Baptist church in Dimapur, Nagaland, serving the Ao tribe with a congregation of roughly 5,000 families. Located in a prominent church building known for its size and parking, DABA focuses on evangelism, missions and community, led by Pastor Rev. Wati Kichu.

## CHUMUKEDIMA

Chümoukedima is a rapidly growing district and town in Nagaland, located 14 km from Dimapur in the Naga Hills foothills. Once the first headquarters of the Naga Hills District (1866), it is now a scenic tourist destination known for waterfalls, the scenic Chumu Viewpoint and the Nagaland Armed Police Training Centre (NAPTC).



## ZOOLOGICAL PARK

The Nagaland Zoological Park in Dimapur is the state's largest zoo and a key wildlife conservation center in Northeast India. Located in the Rangapahar area, it covers 176 hectares of diverse topography, including rolling plateaus and low lying areas that serve as a natural habitat for various species.
