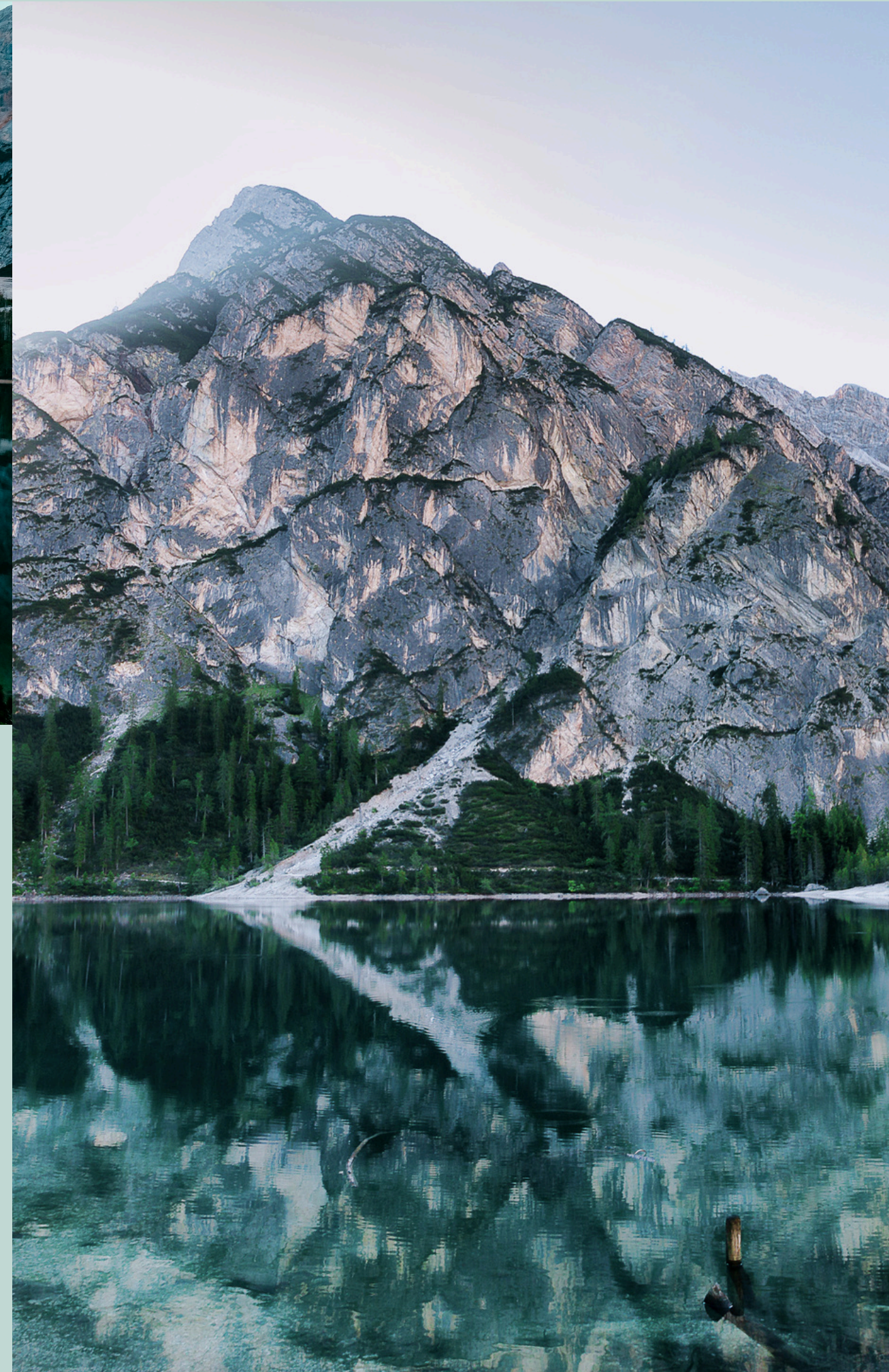


TRAVEL PLAN TO GULMARG

WHERE WINTER FEELS LIKE MAGIC



GULMARG

Gulmarg known as the "Meadow of Flowers," is a premier hill station and skiing destination in Jammu and Kashmir's Baramulla district, situated at 2,650 meters (8,690 feet). Famous for the high altitude Gulmarg Gondola (one of the world's highest) and top tier winter sports, it offers stunning snow covered Himalayan views and is located roughly 54 km from Srinagar.

GULMARG GONDOLA

The Gulmarg Gondola is the world's second highest and second longest cable car system, located in Gulmarg, Jammu and Kashmir, India. It takes visitors from 2,650 meters up to 3,950 meters on Apharwat Peak, offering panoramic views of the Himalayas and providing access for skiing, snowboarding and sightseeing. It operates in two phases. Phase 1 travels from Gulmarg Resort to Kungdoor Station (intermediate bowl) and Phase 2 connects Kungdoor to Apharwat Mountain.



APHARWAT PEAK



Apharwat Peak is a stunning 4,390 meter (14,403 ft) mountain summit in Gulmarg, Jammu and Kashmir, known for its year round snow, panoramic Himalayan views and as the home of Asia's longest ski slopes. Reached via the second phase of the Gulmarg Gondola, it serves as a premier destination for skiing, snowboarding and hiking, offering breathtaking views near the Line of Control.

ALPATHER LAKE



Alpather Lake known as the "Frozen Lake," is a stunning high-altitude alpine lake (4,380m) nestled at the foot of the twin Apharwat Peaks in Gulmarg. It remains frozen until June and is popular for its pristine icy, then emerald, waters, accessible via a 13km trek from Gulmarg or a shorter hike from the Gulmarg Gondola Phase II



STRAWBERRY VALLEY

Strawberry Valley is a serene, offbeat destination in Gulmarg Jammu and Kashmir, celebrated for its sprawling strawberry plantations and breathtaking Himalayan backdrop. Located approximately 4 km from the Gulmarg city centre, it offers a peaceful alternative to the more crowded tourist spots like the Gondola.



GULMARG GOLF COURSE

Located at an altitude of 2,650 metres (8,690 ft), the Gulmarg Golf Course is famously recognized as the highest 18 hole green golf course in the world. Nestled in a natural alpine meadow in the Pir Panjal range, it is the longest golf course in India, spanning 7,505 yards with a par of 72.



ST.MARY'S CHURCH

St. Mary's Church in Gulmarg is a historic 110-year old Roman Catholic church, renowned for its Victorian era architecture and picturesque setting. Built in 1902 during the British Raj, it features distinctive grey stone walls, a green roof and stained glass windows, nestled near the local golf course and surrounded by alpine trees and snowy mountains.



BABA RESHI SHRINE

The Baba Reshi Shrine, located near Gulmarg at about 7,000 feet in Baramulla district, is a revered 15th century Sufi shrine dedicated to Baba Payam-ud-Din Reshi. Famous for its intricate Kashmiri woodwork, deodar pillars and serene forest setting, it attracts visitors of all faiths seeking blessings.

NINGLE NALLAH & FERROZPUR NALLAH

Ningle Nallah and Ferozpur Nallah are serene mountain streams near Gulmarg, offering picturesque spots for picnics, hiking and trout fishing, surrounded by lush green pastures and snow-capped peaks. Ningle Nallah (10 km from Gulmarg) features a small waterfall and originates from Apharwat Peak, while Ferozpur Nallah (5 km away) serves as a base for trekking.





MAHARANI TEMPLE

The Maharani Temple in Gulmarg, also known as Mohineshwar Shivalaya, is a historic Shiv temple built in 1915 by Maharani Mohini Bai Sisodia, wife of Maharaja Hari Singh. Situated on a hillock in the center of Gulmarg, it features a striking red roof and white facade, visible from anywhere in the town.



DRUNG WATERFALL

Drung Waterfall is a popular year-round attraction located near Tangmarg, about 14–16 km from Gulmarg and 42 km from Srinagar. While it flows freely amidst lush greenery in summer, it is most famous for transforming into a stunning frozen spectacle during peak winter, with massive icicles and a partially frozen stream that resembles a scene from "Narnia".
