Kozhikode, also known as Calicut is a historic coastal city in Kerala, renowned as the former capital of the Zamorin kingdom and a major ancient spice trade hub. Known for its rich cultural heritage, Malabar cuisine, and serene beaches, it is a prominent cultural and educational center in India, often called the City of Spices.

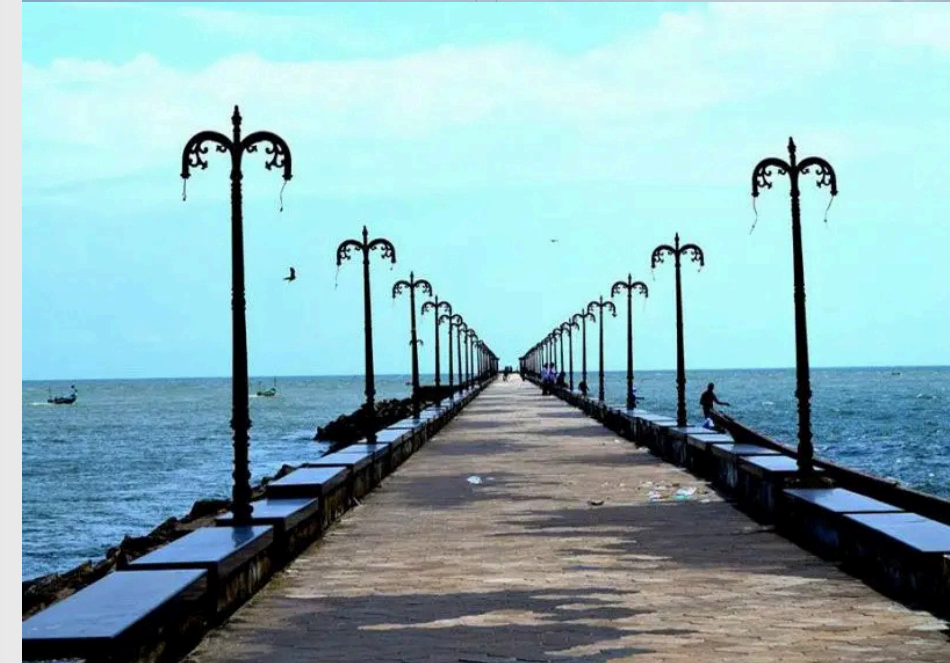

KAPPAD BEACH

Kappad Beach, located 16 km from Kozhikode, Kerala is a historic, serene destination famous as the spot where Vasco da Gama landed on May 20, 1498 marking the start of European maritime trade in India. Known for its rocky headlands, coconut groves and Blue Flag certification for cleanliness, it offers a peaceful retreat with scenic sunsets.



KOZHIKODE BEACH

Kozhikode Beach (Calicut Beach) is a historic popular coastal destination on the Malabar Coast in Kerala, known for its scenic sunsets, golden sands and vibrant local culture. Featuring an old lighthouse and piers, it offers a serene yet lively atmosphere, popular for evening strolls, street food and dolphin spotting.





BEYPORE BEACH

Beypore Beach is a scenic historic coastal destination near Kozhikode in Kerala, famed for its 1 km "Pulimuttu" stone walkway, traditional "Uru" boat-building yards and tranquil golden sands. Located at the Chaliyar River's mouth, it offers stunning sunsets, water sports, and a blend of maritime culture and often, a quiet, rustic atmosphere.



THIKKODI DRIVE -IN BEACH

Thikkodi Drive-In Beach is a rare and scenic coastal destination in the Kozhikode district of Kerala, located about 36 km from Kozhikode city. It is the first drive in beach in Kozhikode and only the second of its kind in Kerala, following the more famous Muzhappilangad Beach in Kannur.

PAYYOLI BEACH

Payyoli Beach, located near Kozhikode in Kerala is a serene and scenic stretch known for its white sand, coconut trees and calm shallow waters ideal for swimming. It is a popular spot for water sports, including speed boating and wind surfing and serves as a nesting ground for endangered Olive Ridley turtles.



THUSHARAGIRI WATERFALLS

Thusharagiri Waterfalls, located 50 km from Kozhikode in Kerala, is a stunning eco-tourism spot in the Western Ghats known for three cascading falls Erattumukku, Mazhavil Chattom and Thumbithullum Para. Translating to "snow capped mountains," the site offers trekking, rock climbing and lush plantation views with the main waterfall plunging 75 meters.



KARIYATHUMPARA

Kariyathumpara is a scenic, eco friendly tourist destination located 45 km from Kozhikode, Kerala known as the "Ooty of Malabar". Surrounded by the Malabar Wildlife Sanctuary, this "hidden gem" features rolling green hills, natural water springs and rock formed pools. It offers a tranquil hillstation like climate on the way to Kakkayam Dam.



KAKKAYAM DAM

Kakkayam Dam is a scenic masonry dam built across the Kuttiyadi River in Kozhikode, Kerala. Commissioned in 1972, this along with the, Kuttiyadi Hydro Electric Project is a popular eco tourism spot offering speedboat rides in the reservoir, trekking and views of the Urakkuzhi waterfall. Surrounded by the Malabar Wildlife Sanctuary, it offers potential wildlife sightings like elephants and bison.





VAYALADA

Vayalada is a scenic 2,000 ft high hill station in Kerala's Kozhikode district, often called the "Gavi of Malabar" or "Ooty of Malabar". Located ~40 km from Kozhikode, it is a popular weekend trekking destination offering panoramic views of the Peruvannamuzhi Dam, misty hills and lush green landscapes.



SAROVARAM BIOPARK

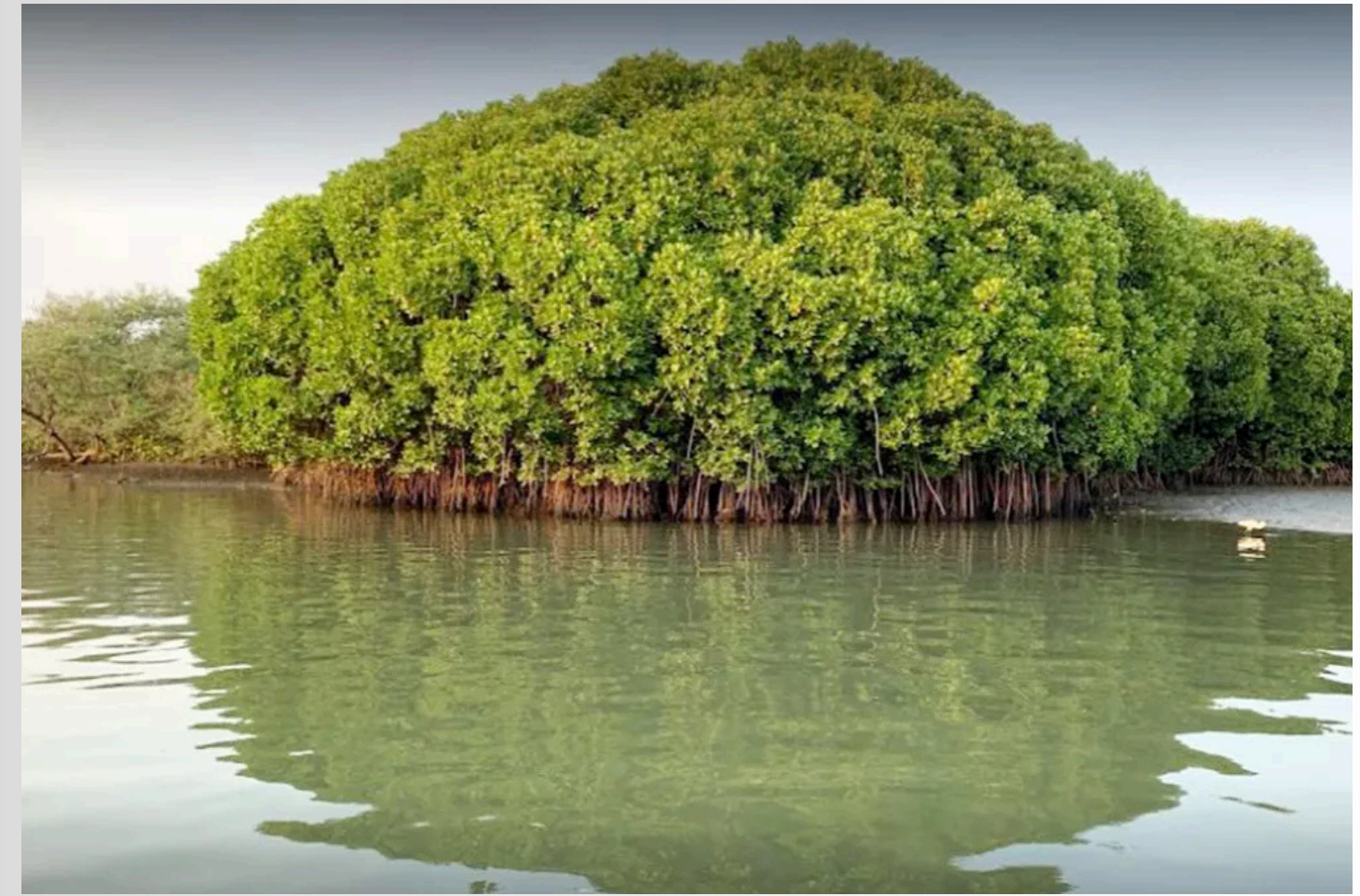
Sarovaram Biopark in Kozhikode, Kerala, is a 200 acre protected eco tourism destination designed to conserve wetlands and mangrove forests. Located near the NH Bypass, it serves as a green space offering boating, a butterfly park, an otter park and a scenic canal walk.

KADALUNDI BIRD SANCTUARY

The Kadalundi Bird Sanctuary is a scenic cluster of islands located 25 km from Kozhikode in Kerala, where the Kadalundi River meets the Arabian Sea. It serves as a vital habitat for over 60 species of migratory birds (e.g., Terns, Gulls) and 100+ native species, featuring lush mangrove forests and a thriving ecosystem.

SARGAALAYA KERALA ARTS & CRAFTS VILLAGE

Sargaalaya Kerala Arts & Crafts Village in Iringal, Kozhikode, is a 20-acre, eco-friendly destination established in 2011 by the Kerala Tourism Department. Managed by the Uralungal Labour Contract Co-operative Society, it showcases over 60 stalls featuring traditional, live demonstrations of handcrafted products like coconut shells, coir and pottery.
