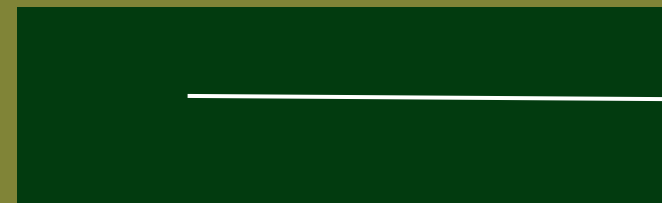

SOLAN

Solan is a picturesque hill town in Himachal Pradesh, known as the "Mushroom City of India" and "City of Red Gold" for its agricultural production. Located 46 km from Shimla, it serves as a major industrial, educational and agricultural hub while offering a quieter, nature focused alternative to busier hill stations.

JATOLI SHIV TEMPLE

Located near Solan in Himachal Pradesh, the Jatoli Shiv Temple is acclaimed as one of Asia's tallest Shiva temples, known for its stunning Southern Dravidian architecture 39 year construction period (starting 1974) and hilltop location. Dedicated to Lord Shiva, the temple features a crystal Shiva Lingam and a mystical water tank named "Jal Kund".



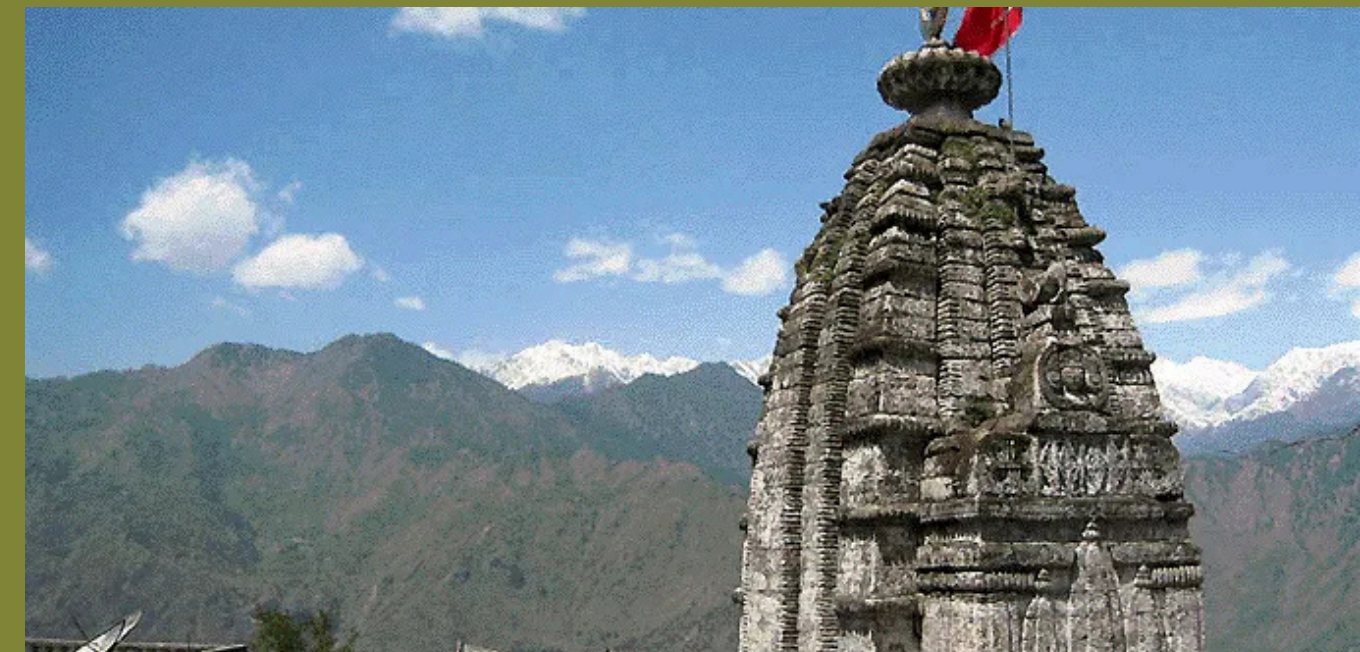
MOHAN SHAKTI HERITAGE PARK

Mohan Shakti Heritage Park in Solan is a 40 acre, modern era heritage complex nestled in the Himalayan foothills at Harat, near Solan, Himachal Pradesh. Built by Kapil Mohan, it features a large temple, life size statues of Vedic figures, animals and landscaped gardens, promoting Vedic science and Indian culture.



SHOOLINI DEVI TEMPLE

The Shoolini Devi Temple in Solan, Himachal Pradesh. It is an ancient and highly revered shrine dedicated to Goddess Shoolini an incarnation of Maa Durga. Located on Shilly Road it is believed to be the town's namesake and acts as the spiritual protector of Solan. The temple is renowned for its vibrant three day Shoolini Fair held every June.





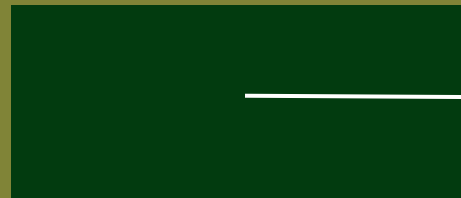
KASAULI

Kasauli is a serene, colonial-era cantonment town in Himachal Pradesh's Solan district, established by the British in 1842. Located around 1,900 meters high, it offers a peaceful getaway with views of the Shivalik hills. Key attractions include the Gilbert Trail, Monkey Point and the historic Mall Road.



CHAIL

Chail is a quiet scenic hill station in Himachal Pradesh's Solan district, located about 38 km from Solan and 45 km from Shimla. Known for the royal Chail Palace, the world's highest cricket ground (2,444 m) and panoramic Himalayan views. It offers a serene, less crowded alternative to Shimla.





KAROL TIBBA

Karol Tibba is the highest peak in Himachal Pradesh's Solan district, standing at approximately 2,240–2,260 meters (7,500 ft). Known for an easy to moderate 11 km trek. It features the historic Pandava Cave, panoramic views of the Shivaliks and Shimla and a serene forested trail often completed in a single day.



DAGSHAI

Dagshai is one of the oldest and quietest cantonment towns in Himachal Pradesh's Solan district, established by the East India Company in 1847. Perched at 6,000 feet near Kasauli. It is known for its British era history, including the 1849 Dagshai Jail Museum scenic hiking trails and historical churches.



KUTHAR FORT

Kuthar Fort located near Kasauli in Himachal Pradesh's Solan district, is an 800-year-old royal structure featuring traditional Rajputana architecture, including wooden pillars, carved arches and ancient temples. Situated in a quiet, forested area. It is a 52.8 sq km heritage site and former residence of the Kuthar family.

SOLAN BREWERY

Established in 1855 by Edward Dyer, the Solan Brewery (now often associated with the Kasauli Brewery/Distillery in the Solan district) is one of India's oldest breweries and operating distilleries. Located near Solan, Himachal Pradesh, it was originally famous for producing Asia's first beer, "Lion Beer" and now operates under Mohan Meakin Ltd.
