Thrissur, known as the "Cultural Capital of Kerala" is a vibrant city in central Kerala, India, renowned for its rich heritage, ancient temples and the spectacular Thrissur Pooram festival. It serves as a major center for arts, culture and traditional performances, including Kathakali and Mohiniyattam.

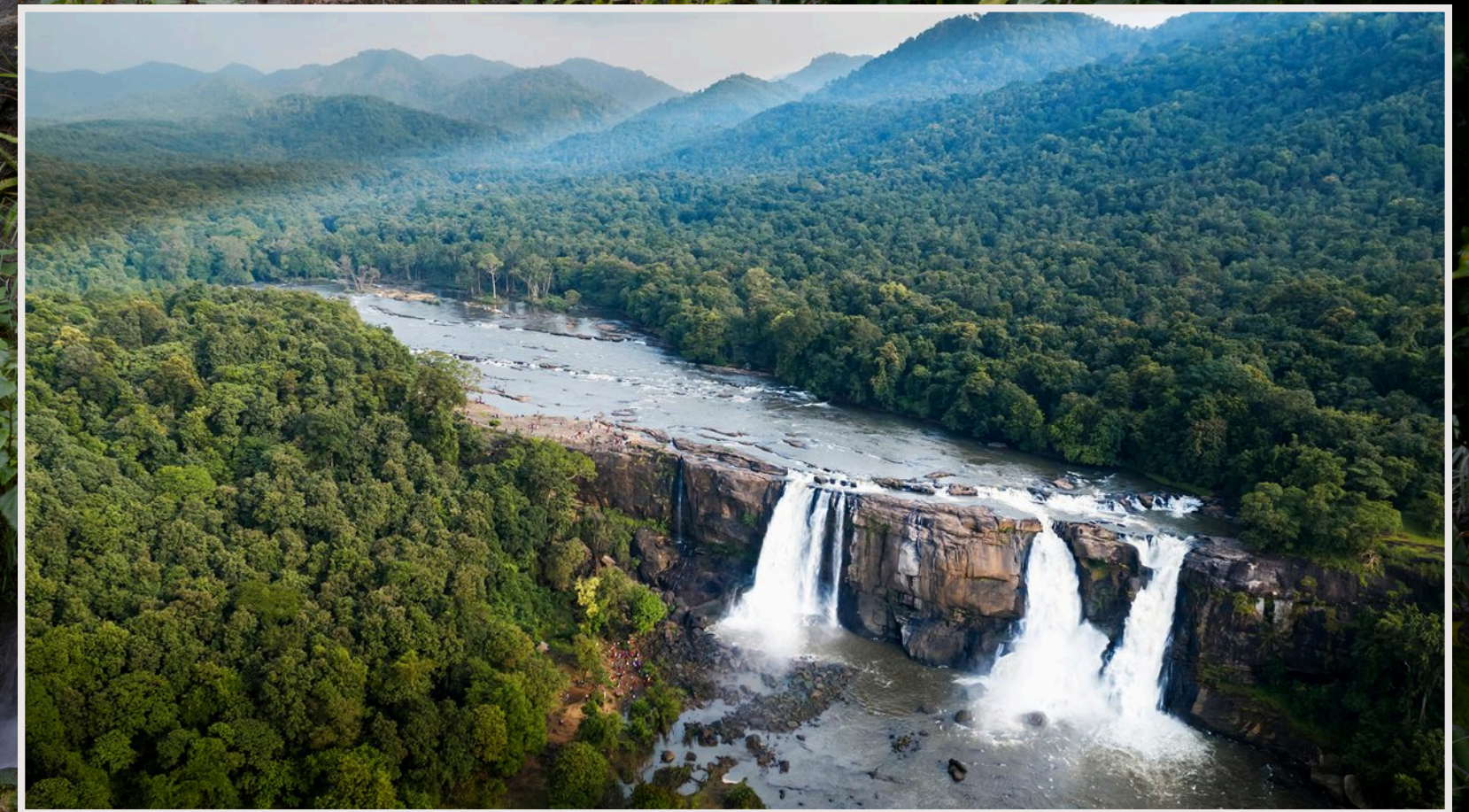

ATHIRAPPILLY WATERFALLS

Athirappilly Waterfalls known as the "Niagara of India," is Kerala's largest waterfall, plummeting 80 feet down the Chalakudy River in Thrissur. Situated near the Sholayar Forest Range, it is a premier scenic spot offering stunning views from both top and bottom, popular for nature lovers and filmmakers.



VADAKKUMNATHAN TEMPLE

The Sree Vadakkumnathan Temple is an ancient Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Shiva located in the heart of Thrissur, Kerala. Known as one of the oldest Shiva temples in the state, it is a masterclass in traditional Kerala architecture and serves as the backdrop for the world famous Thrissur Pooram festival.



SHAKTHAN THAMPURAN PALACE

The Shakthan Thampuran Palace also known as the Vadakkekara Palace is a landmark in the heart of Thrissur that serves as a testament to the "Golden Age" of the Cochin dynasty. Originally known as Vadakkechira Kovilakam, it was reconstructed in its present Kerala-Dutch architectural style in 1795 by King Rama Varma Shakthan Thampuran, the founder of modern Thrissur.



GURUVAYUR TEMPLE

Punnathur Kotta (Anakkotta) located 3 km from the famous Guruvayur Temple in Thrissur, Kerala is a unique elephant sanctuary housing over 50 elephants owned by the temple. Situated in a 10-acre fort (formerly a Raja's palace), it acts as a conservation site where elephants are groomed, trained for festivals and treated.





CHAVAKKAD BEACH

Chavakkad Beach is a serene coastal destination in Thrissur, Kerala, famous for its golden sands, coconut groves and the unique Azhimukam (river-sea confluence). Located 5 km from Guruvayur, it features a floating bridge, tranquil waters ideal for swimming, and a popular lighthouse, making it a peaceful, less-crowded alternative for tourists.



VAZHACHAL FALLS

Vazhachal Falls is a picturesque 300-foot wide, cascading waterfall located on the Chalakudy River in Thrissur, Kerala, near the famous Athirappilly Falls. Known for its lush surrounding rainforests and as a habitat for endangered species like the Great Indian Hornbill, it offers a scenic, tranquil and accessible nature experience popular for families.



PEECHI DAM

Peechi Dam, located about 22-23 km from Thrissur, Kerala is a scenic reservoir built across the Manali River in the 1950s (opened 1957). Primarily serving as a crucial irrigation and drinking water source for Thrissur City, it is also a popular tourist spot known for boating, landscaped botanical gardens and views of the surrounding Peechi Vazhani Wildlife Sanctuary.



VILANGAN KUNNU

Vilangan Kunnu, often called the "Oxygen Jar" of Thrissur is a scenic 10 acre hilltop park located 7-9 km from Thrissur city center. It is a popular tourist destination offering panoramic views of the city, the Thrissur Kole Wetlands and sunsets. It features a children's park, a walkway and lush green surroundings, making it a peaceful getaway.

KERALA KALAMANDALAM

Founded in 1930 by poet Vallathol Narayana Menon in Cheruthuruthy, Thrissur, Kerala Kalamandalam is a premier deemed university dedicated to preserving Kerala's traditional performing arts, particularly Kathakali. It operates on the Gurukul system on the banks of the Bharathapuzha River, offering training in classical dance and music.



CHEPPARA ROCK GARDEN

Cheppara Rock Garden is a massive natural rock formation in Thrissur, Kerala, spread over a one-kilometre area. Often described as a "mini Table Mountain," it offers stunning 360-degree panoramic views of the surrounding green forests and the towns of Wadakkanchery and Thrissur.
