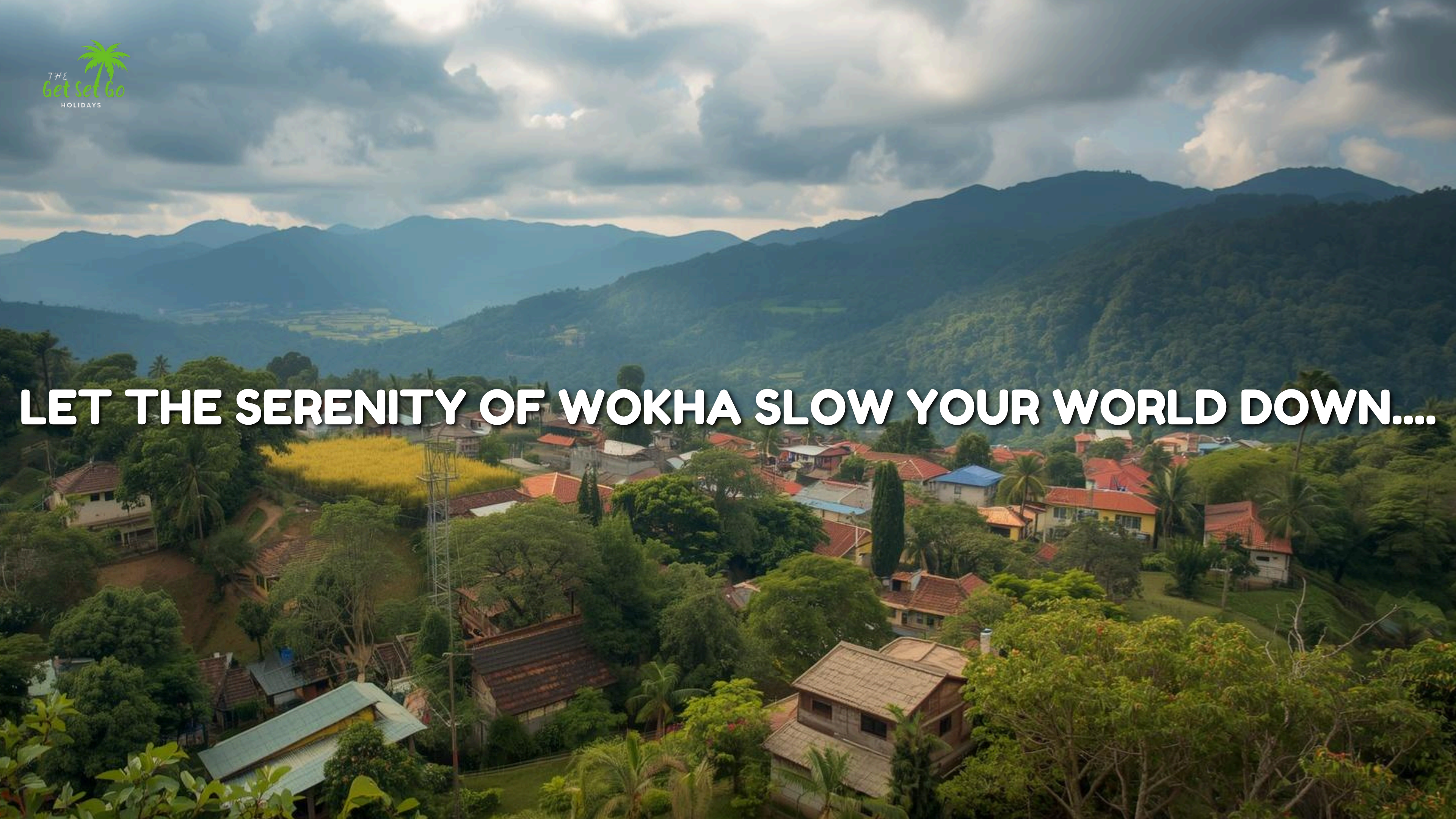

WOKHA

Wokha is a scenic town and district in central Nagaland, Northeast India, primarily inhabited by the Lotha Naga tribe. Located 80 km from Kohima at the foot of the Wokha Hills, it is known as the "District of Plenty" for its agricultural wealth, particularly oranges, passion fruit and pineapples.

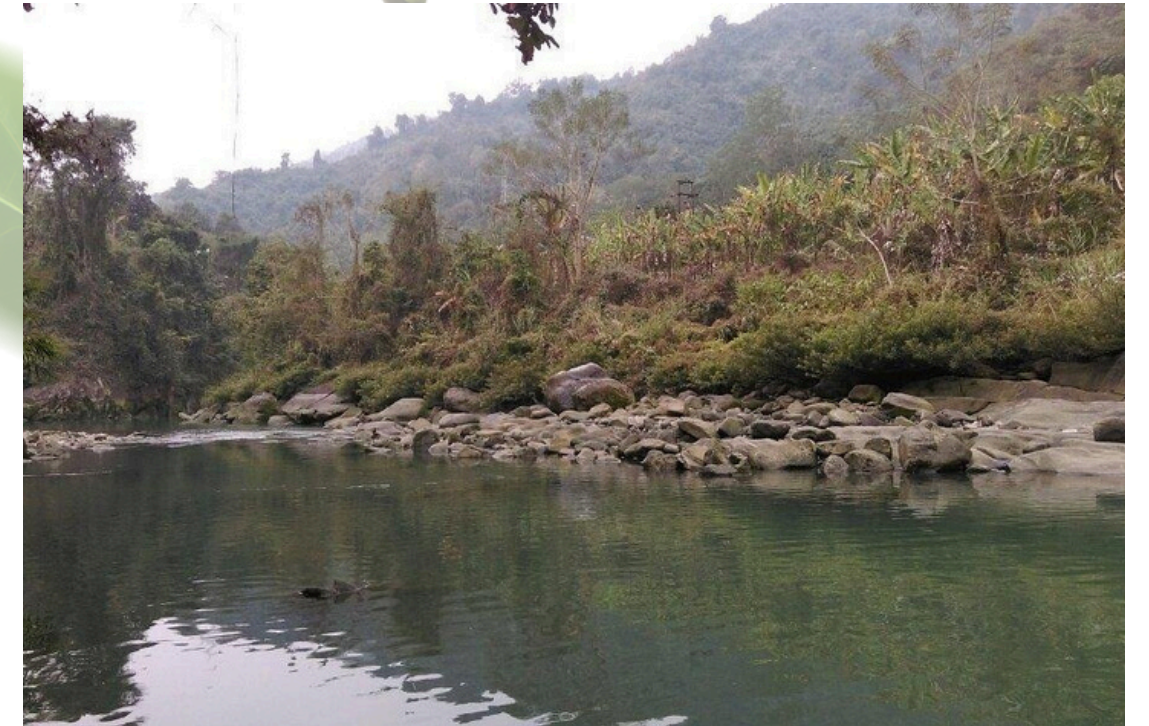

DOYANG HYDRO PROJECT & RIVER

The Doyang Hydro Project is a 75 MW (3x25 MW) hydroelectric power station commissioned in July 2000, situated on the Doyang River in Wokha district, Nagaland, India. Managed by NEEPCO, the earthen dam is 92 meters high and 462 meters long, creating a large reservoir that serves as a major tourist spot, known for hosting migratory Amur Falcons.





LIPHANYAN GOVERNOR'S CAMP

Liphanyan Governor's Camp is a popular scenic tourist spot in Wokha, Nagaland situated about 43–45 km from Dimapur near the Doyang River. Known for its stunning views of the river meandering through mountains, it serves as a serene spot for picnics, trekking, angling and rafting.



TOTSU WOZHU LAKE

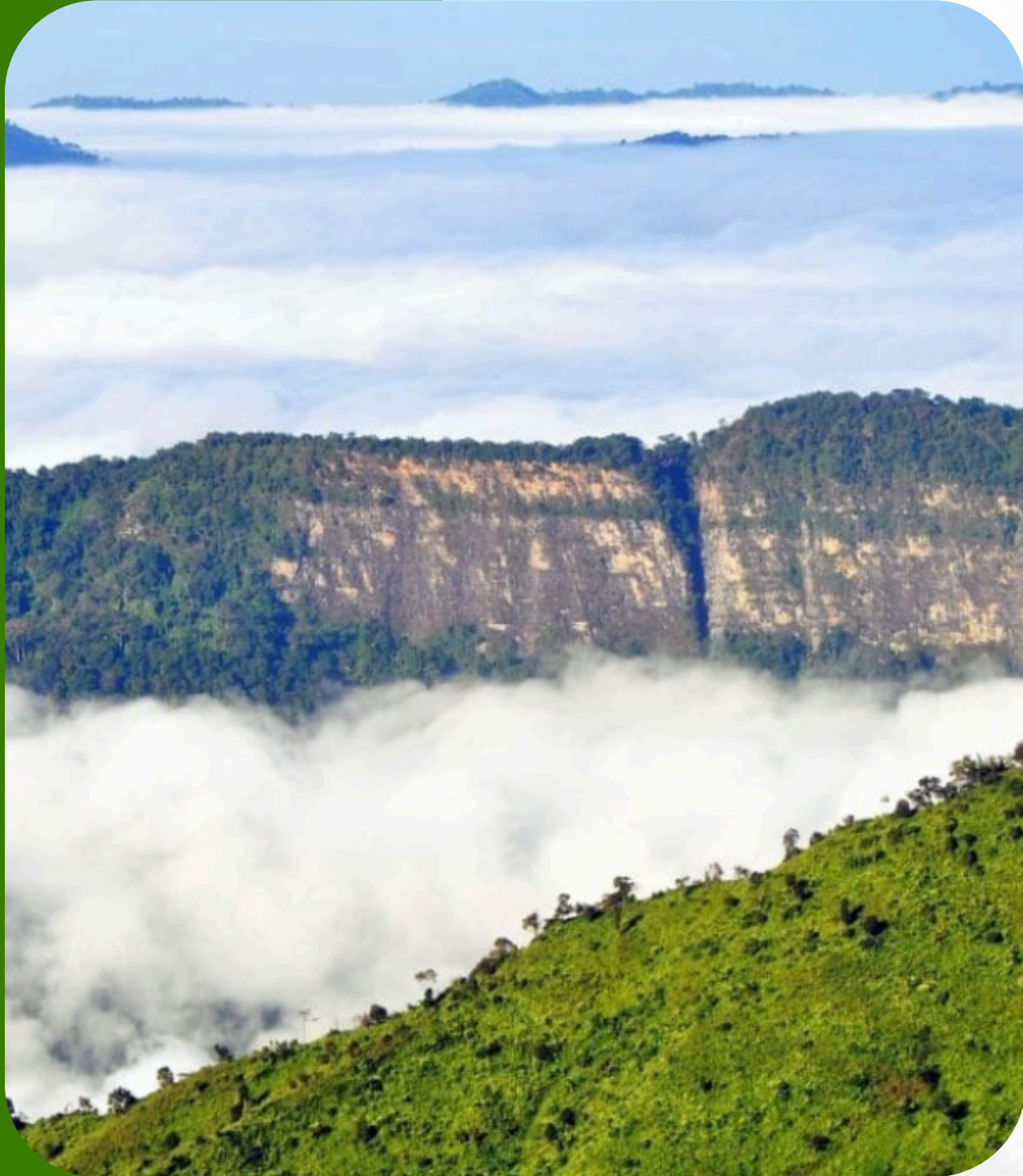
Totsu Wozhu Lake is a serene natural 1 acre lake in Wokha, Nagaland, located in the Phiru shaki area. Renowned for its calm, tranquil and scenic environment, the lake is a popular destination for nature lovers, offering visitors an opportunity to experience lush, quiet surroundings and diverse local hill fish.



VANKHOSUNG

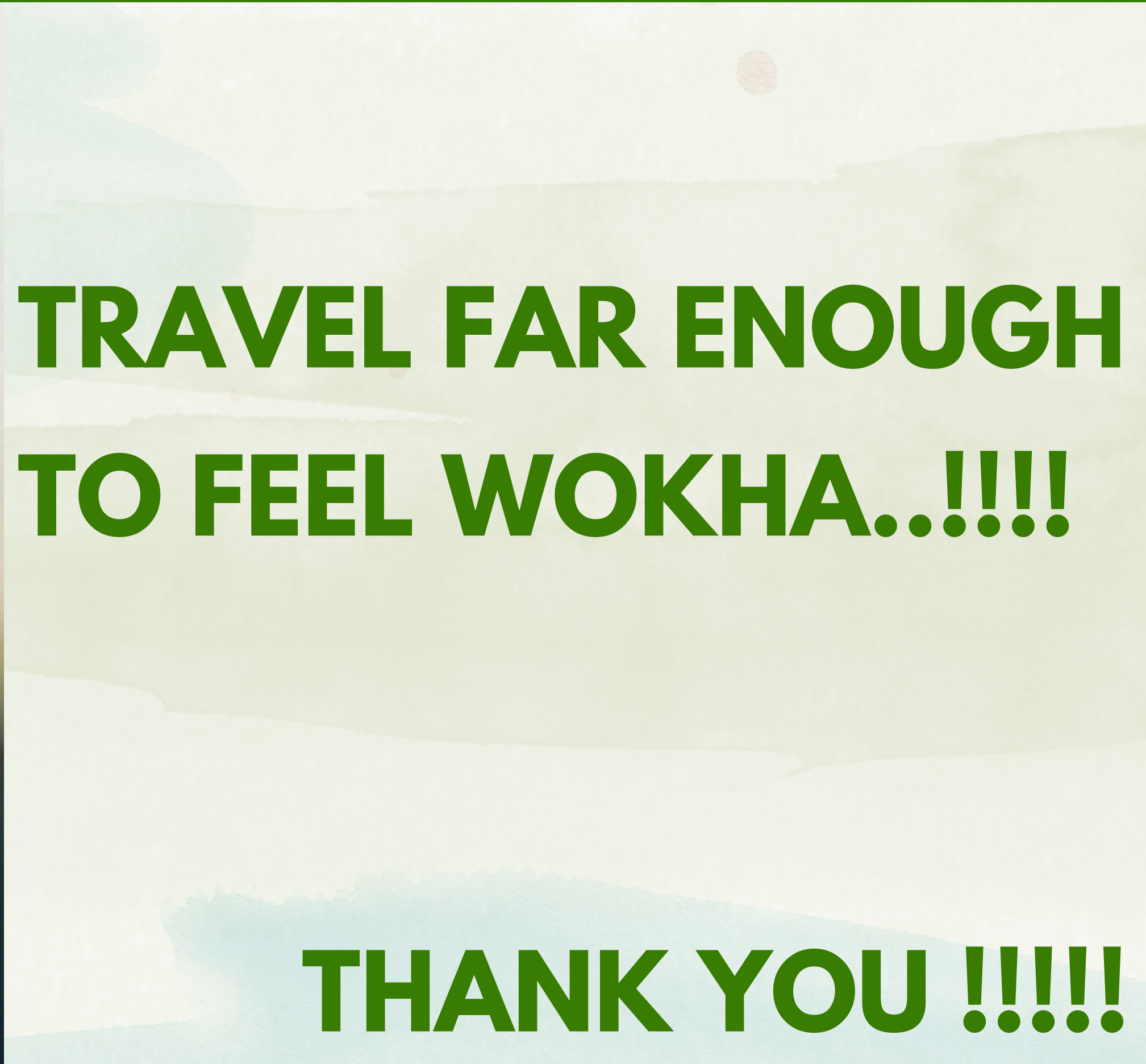
Vankhosung, located 4 km north of Wokha in Nagaland is a significant historical and tourist site known as the birthplace of Christianity in the region. Established in 1923, it hosts the Kyon Baptist Ekhumkho Sanrhyütsü (KBES) mission compound. Situated in the foothills of Mt. Tyi, it offers cultural insights educational institutions and a scenic environment.





MOUNT TIYI

Mount Tiyi, located in the Wokha district of Nagaland, India is a renowned 1,969 meter high mountain popular for trekking, adventure sports and scenic views of the surrounding valleys. Steeped in local folklore, it is often referred to as the "mountain of life" or the mythical abode of departed souls.
