ULUWATU TEMPLE

Uluwatu Temple (Pura Luhur Uluwatu) in Bali is a breathtaking 11th century Hindu sea temple perched on a 70-meter high cliff in the Bukit Peninsula. Renowned for stunning Indian Ocean views, sunset Kecak fire dances and mischievous long tailed macaques, it is one of Bali's nine key directional temples.



TANAH LOT TEMPLE

Tanah Lot Temple, located in Tabanan, Bali, is an iconic 16th-century Hindu sea temple perched on a rocky outcrop, famously known for its dramatic sunset views and "floating" appearance during high tide. Dedicated to the sea god Dewa Baruna, it is a crucial pilgrimage site featuring sacred snakes and a holy spring, heavily restored with artificial rock.





TIRTA EMPUL TEMPLE

Tirta Empul is a sacred 10th-century Hindu water temple in Tampaksiring, Bali, famous for its holy spring water used for melukat (purification rituals). Dedicated to Vishnu, it features with a large, clear water source, 30+ showers in central pools where visitors cleanse their body, mind and spirit.



BESAKIH TEMPLE

Besakih Temple, known as Bali's "Mother Temple" (Pura Besakih), is the largest, oldest and holiest Hindu complex on the island, situated nearly 1,000 meters up the slopes of the sacred Mount Agung. It comprises over 80 individual temples maintaining a 1,000-year history with Pura Penataran Agung as the central most significant site.

UBUD MONKEY FOREST

The Ubud Monkey Forest (Sacred Monkey Forest Sanctuary) in Bali is a popular nature reserve and 14th-century Hindu temple complex inhabited by over 1,260 Balinese long-tailed macaques. Located in Padangtegal, it serves as a spiritual, educational and conservation center where visitors can walk through lush jungle trails, see ancient statues and observe the monkeys in their semi-wild habitat.



TEGALLALANG RICE TERRACES

The Tegallalang Rice Terraces in Ubud, Bali are iconic, UNESCO-recognized cascading rice paddies known for their ancient subak (traditional Balinese irrigation system). Located 25 minutes north of Ubud, they offer breathtaking green landscapes, walking paths and popular tourist photo spots like the Bali Swing, making them a must-visit, especially at sunrise or sunset.





MOUNT BATUR

Mount Batur is an active volcano in Bali, Indonesia, standing 1,717 meters above sea level. Known for its sunrise trek, the hike takes roughly 2 hours offering panoramic views of Lake Batur and surrounding mountains. It is a popular, relatively easy-to-moderate adventure that includes exploring volcanic craters and relaxing in nearby hot springs.



WATERFALLS

Bali's waterfalls, primarily located in the lush north and central regions, are iconic natural attractions featuring dramatic jungle settings, scenic, steep hikes and cooling pools. Popular spots like Sekumpul, Nungnung and Tukad Cepung (cave based) are best visited early in the morning to avoid crowds and during or just after the rainy season (April-October) for the best flow.

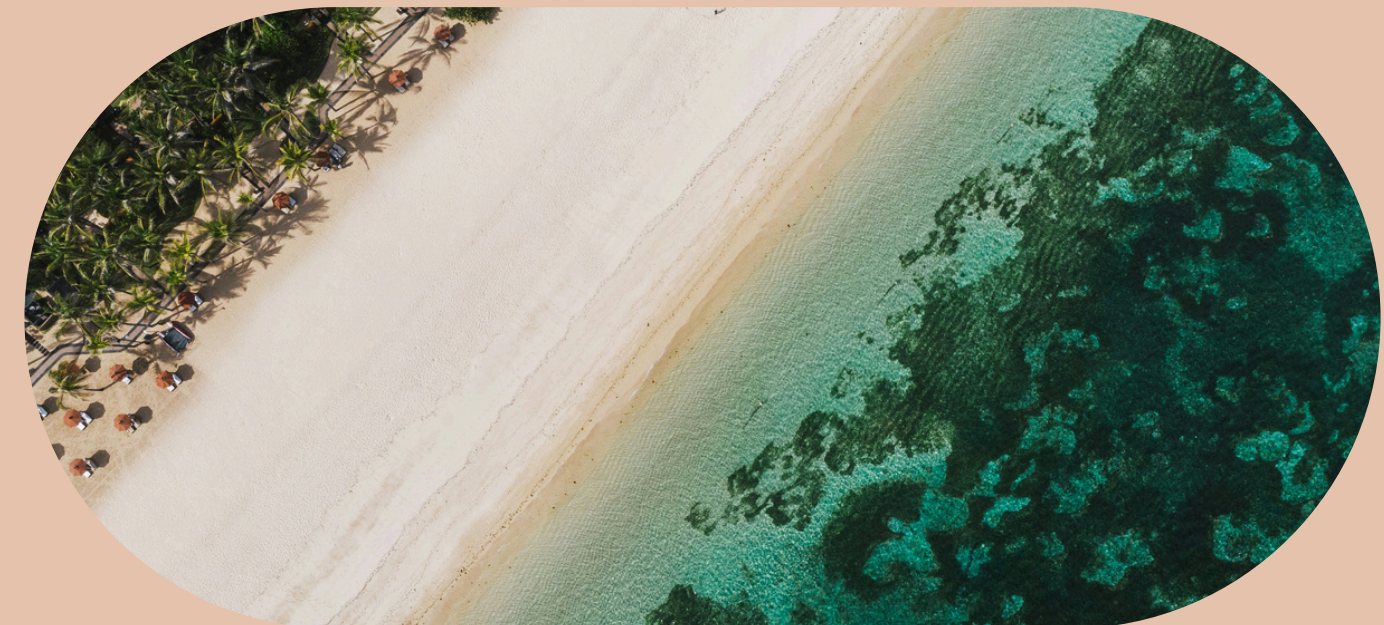


NUSA PENIDA

Nusa Penida is a rugged scenic island southeast of Bali, Indonesia, renowned for its dramatic limestone cliffs, turquoise waters and Instagram famous spots like Kelingking Beach and Broken Beach. It is a popular, faster paced alternative to Bali for adventure travelers, offering world class diving, manta ray snorkeling and incredible sunsets.

NUSA DUA BEACH

Nusa Dua Beach in Bali is a premier, upscale coastal destination known for its pristine white sands, crystal-clear turquoise waters and calm swimmable sea. Located on the southeastern coast, it serves as a tranquil, secured retreat featuring luxury five star resorts, water sports and well maintained public access areas.





CANGGU & SEMINAYAK

Canggu and Seminyak are neighboring coastal hotspots in southern Bali, offering distinct vibes: Canggu is a trendy, bohemian surf hub favored by digital nomads, known for rice paddies, hipster cafes and beach clubs like Finns. Seminyak is more polished and sophisticated, offering luxury resorts, upscale shopping and iconic beach bars such as Potato Head.



LOVINA

Lovina is a serene, laid back resort area on Bali's northern coast, renowned for its black volcanic sand beaches, stunning dolphin-watching boat trips and affordable, slow-paced atmosphere. As a quieter alternative to southern Bali, it offers snorkeling, coral reefs, hot springs and close proximity to scenic waterfalls.





GARUDA WISHNU KENCANA (GWK)

Garuda Wisnu Kencana (GWK) Cultural Park in Bali is a 240 hectare park focused on a 121 meter tall statue of Lord Vishnu riding the mythical Garuda bird. Designed by Nyoman Nuarta and inaugurated in 2018, it is one of the world's tallest statues, symbolizing, wisdom, courage and environmental preservation.



BALI SAFARI & MARINE PARK

Bali Safari & Marine Park is a premier 40 hectare conservation facility in Gianyar, Bali, hosting over 100 species including rare Sumatran tigers and elephants in naturalistic habitats. It offers safari tram journeys, a Water Park and the Mara River Safari Lodge for overnight stays, plus the Tsavo Lion Restaurant for dining alongside lions.
