CHAMBA

Chamba is a historic town and district in Himachal Pradesh, India, founded in the 6th century. Situated along the Ravi River at an altitude of 996–1,006 meters, it is renowned for its ancient 10th-century temples, the Bhuri Singh Museum, and traditional Chamba Rumal embroidery. The town features a moderate climate and serves as a cultural hub known for its scenic landscapes and the annual Minjar Mela.

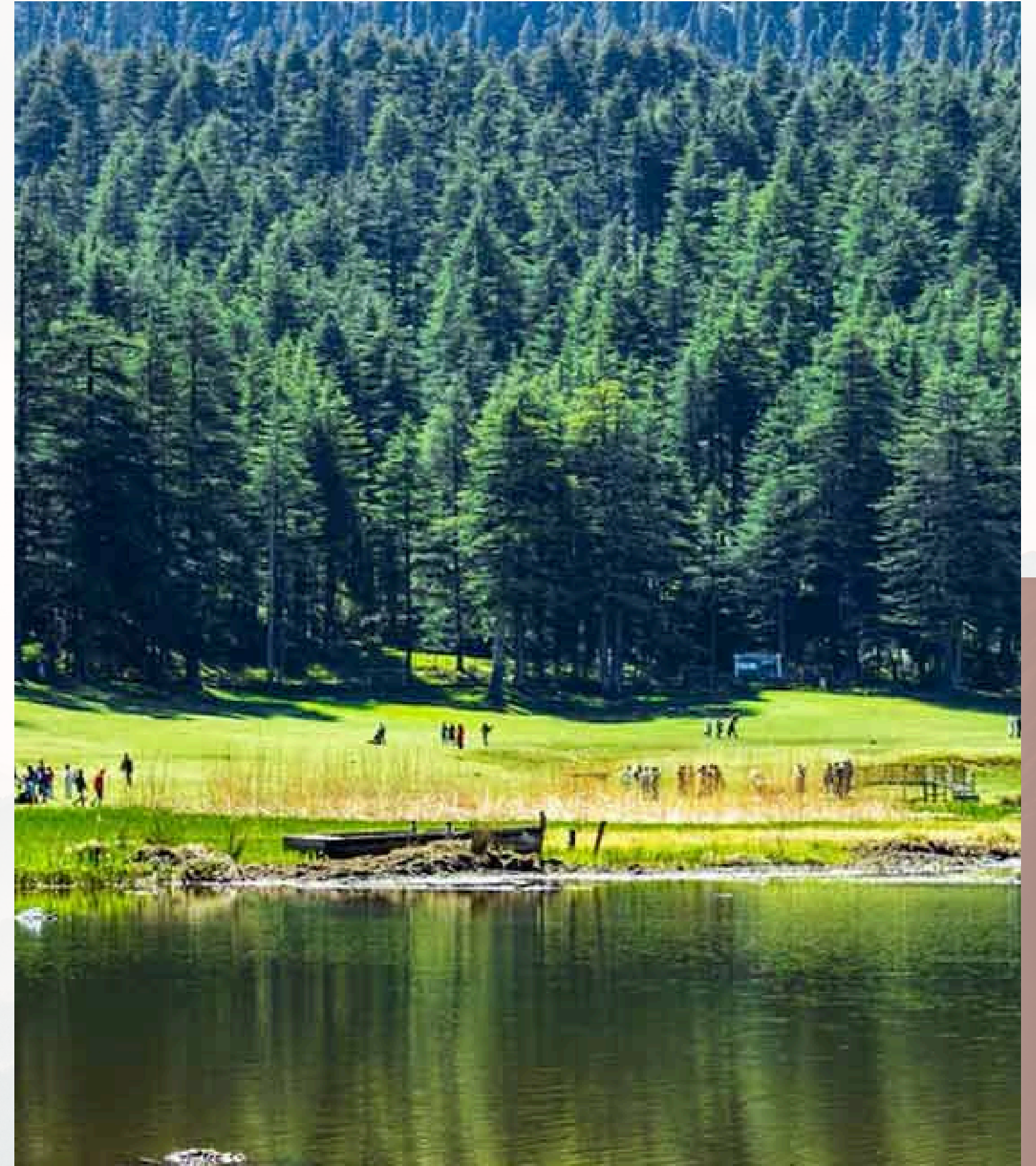

KHAJJIAR LAKE & MEADOW

Khajjiar Lake and its surrounding meadows, located in the Chamba district of Himachal Pradesh near Dalhousie, are renowned as the "Mini Switzerland of India" due to their lush green landscapes, dense deodar forests, and serene, saucer-shaped topography. Sitting at over 6,500 ft, this picturesque spot offers a tranquil escape with a small lake featuring a floating island.





MANIMAHESH LAKE & PEAK

Manimahesh Lake and Peak, located in Himachal Pradesh's Chamba district, form a major sacred pilgrimage site, often considered the abode of Lord Shiva. Situated at 13,390 ft in the Pir Panjal Range, the lake hosts an annual "Manimahesh Yatra" (fair) in August/September, featuring a holy dip beneath the 18,547 ft Manimahesh Kailash Peak.





CHAMERA DAM & LAKE

Chamera Dam and Lake, located near Dalhousie in Himachal Pradesh's Chamba district, constitute a major hydroelectric project (1,300+ MW capacity) built on the Ravi River at 1,700 meters. The artificial lake is a popular tourist spot known for its stunning mountain views, boating, and watersports, surrounded by lush pine and deodar forests.



BHARMOUR

Bharmour, located in Himachal Pradesh's Chamba district at roughly 2,100–2,200 meters, is an ancient town known as the "Abode of Shiva". Famous for the 7th-century Chaurasi Temple Complex featuring 84 shrines. It serves as the base for the Manimahesh Kailash pilgrimage and is home to the Gaddi tribal community.



CHAMPAVATI TEMPLES



The Champavati Temple in Chamba, Himachal Pradesh, is an ancient 10th-century shrine built by Raja Sahil Varman in memory of his daughter, Champavati. Situated near the Treasury building, it is renowned for its Shikhara style architecture, intricate stone carvings and a distinct large wheel on its roof, dedicated to the Goddess Mahisasuramardini.



KALATOP WILDLIFE SANCTUARY

Kalatop Khajjiar Sanctuary or simply Kalamatop Sanctuary, is a 30.69 km animal sanctuary at Kalamatop and Khajjiar in the Chamba district of Himachal Pradesh, India. The sanctuary area is well laid out for trekking trails both at Kalamatop and Khajjiar.



SACH PASS

Sach Pass is a high altitude mountain pass in Himachal Pradesh, India, connecting Chamba to the remote Pangj Valley in the Pir Panjal Range. Situated at over 4,400 meters (approx. 14,500 ft), it is known as a dangerous, thrilling, and scenic adventure route open from June to October, popular for rugged jeep drives and snow trekking.
