WHERE THE TRAIL ENDS AND THE SKY BEGINS



CHOPTA

Chopta is a serene picturesque hill station nestled in the Garhwal Himalayas of Uttarakhand, India, often referred to as the "Mini Switzerland of India". Located at an altitude of approximately 2,608 to 2,900 meters (roughly 8,500–9,500 feet), it is a part of the Kedarnath Wildlife Sanctuary and is known for its lush green meadows (bugyals), dense forests, and stunning panoramic views of snow capped Himalayan peaks like Chaukhamba, Nanda Devi and Kedar Dome.

TUNGNATH TEMPLE

Tungnath, located in Uttarakhand's Rudraprayag district at 3,680 meters (12,073 ft), is the world's highest Shiva temple and the highest of the Panch Kedar temples. Believed to be over 1,000 years old, it is closely linked to the Pandavas from the Mahabharata. A 3.5 km trek from Chopta leads to this shrine, often visited along with the nearby Chandrashila peak, which offers panoramic Himalayan views.



CHANDRASHILA PEAK

Chandrashila Peak, located at approximately 3,690–4,000 meters (12,110–13,123 ft) in Uttarakhand, is the scenic summit of the Chandranath Parvat above Tungnath Temple. Famous for its 360 degree views of Himalayan peaks like Nanda Devi, Chaukhamba, and Kedar, it is popular for its relatively accessible, moderate level trek which is especially stunning during spring rhododendron blooms and winter snowfall.



DEORIA TAL

Deoria Tal is a stunning, high altitude freshwater lake located at 2,438 meters near Sari village in Uttarakhand's Rudraprayag district. Known for its crystal-clear reflections of the Chaukhamba peaks and lush surrounding forests, it is a popular, easy-to-moderate trekking destination with mythological ties to the Pandavas and Indra.

KANCHULA KORAK MUSK DEER SCANTUARY

Kanchula Korak Musk Deer Sanctuary is a 5 sq km protected area near Chopta in Uttarakhand, dedicated to conserving the endangered Himalayan Musk Deer. Established in 1981-82, this high altitude sanctuary is known for its dense Rhododendron forests, rich birdlife, and as a key research site for breeding rare species.



SARI VILLAGE

Sari Village (or Saari Gaon) is a quiet picturesque hamlet in Uttarakhand's Rudraprayag district, located at 2,000 meters, known as the primary base camp for the trekking to the scenic Deoria Tal Lake. Surrounded by oak and rhododendron forests, this Garhwali village is known for its step farming, traditional architecture, and close proximity to Chopta.





ROHINI BUGYAL

Rohini Bugyal is a serene, high-altitude alpine meadow located at 3,300–3,800 meters within the dense oak and rhododendron forests of Uttarakhand's Chopta Valley. It is a key, tranquil camping spot on the Deoriatal-Chopta-Chandrashila trek, offering panoramic views of Garhwal Himalayan peaks like Kedarnath and Chaukhamba.



DUGALBITTA

Dugalbitta is a serene, high-altitude hamlet located at 2,600 meters in the Chopta region of Uttarakhand, India, nestled within the Kedarnath Wildlife Sanctuary. Known as a tranquil alternative to bustling hill stations, it offers breathtaking views of the Himalayan range (Trishul, Nanda Devi, Chaukhamba) and serves as a base for trekking to Tungnath and Chandrashila.
