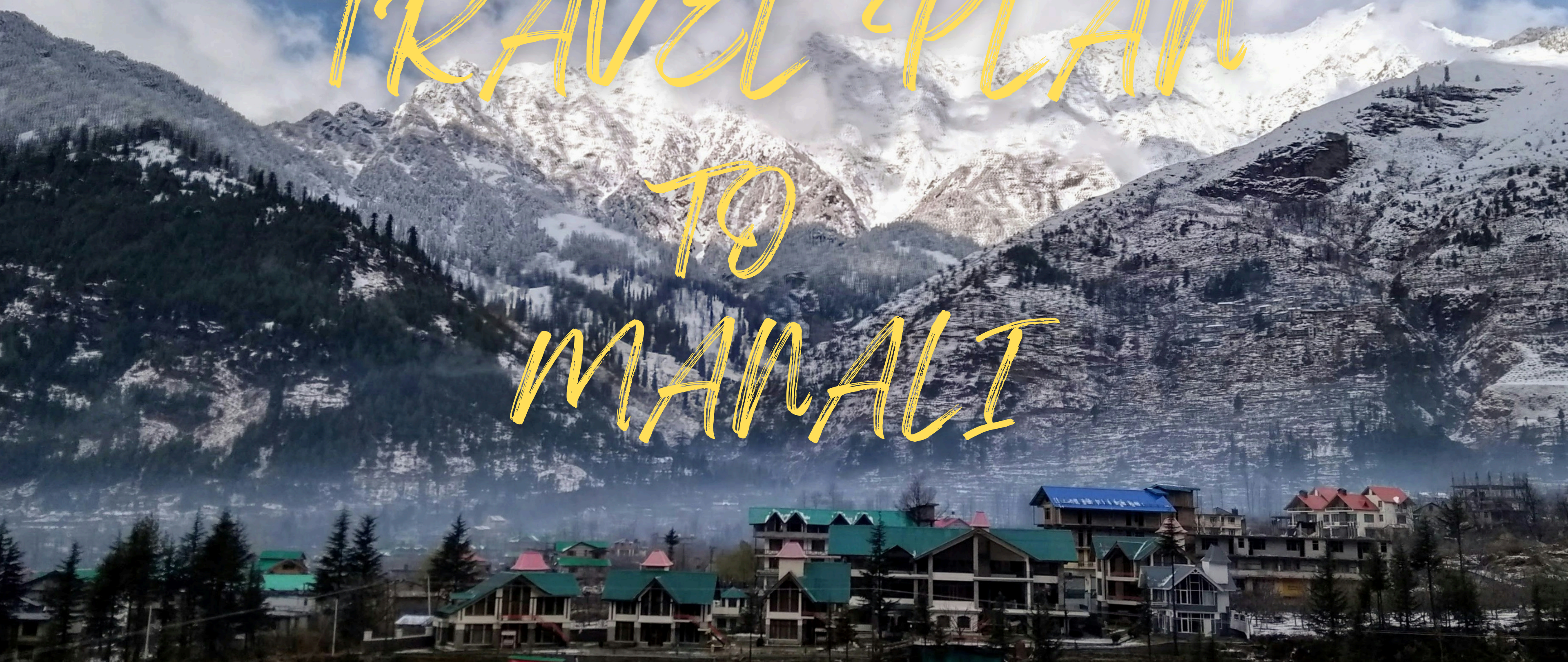


TRAVEL PLAN TO MANALI

MANALI

Manali is a scenic hill station in Himachal Pradesh located in the Kullu Valley at 1,929 meters renowned for its snow-capped mountains deodar forests and adventure sports. Known as the "Abode of Manu," it serves as a popular year-round destination for honeymooners nature lovers and tourists seeking adventure near the Rohtang Pass .



The Best time to visit Manali is from March to June for pleasant weather and outdoor activities and from October to February for snow lovers and winter sports. Summer offers temperatures of perfect for sightseeing, while winter (especially January-February) provides a magical snow-covered landscape.

HADIMBA DEVI TEMPLE



The Hadimba Devi Temple or Dhungri Temple is a 16th-century, pagoda-style wooden temple in Manali Himachal Pradesh dedicated to Hidimba Devi. The wife of Bhima from the Mahabharata. Surrounded by cedar forests it features unique architecture a shrine built around a rocky cave and a footprint of the goddess.

VAN BIHAR NATIONAL PARK



Van Vihar Manali is a popular municipal nature park and public garden located near the city center (Mall Road) in Manali Himachal Pradesh. Known for its dense Deodar trees the riverside park offers a serene environment for walking a man-made lake for boating and a quiet retreat from the city.

OLD MANALI



Old Manali is a serene charming village located about 3 km uphill from the bustling New Manali in Himachal Pradesh, India. Renowned for its bohemian vibe scenic apple orchards and rustic wooden houses. it serves as a popular backpacker hub offering a quieter nature-focused alternative to the main town often featuring cafes with live music.

BHRIGU LAKE



Bhrigu Lake is a high-altitude glacial lake located at ~14,100 feet in Himachal Pradesh's Kullu district renowned for its crystal-clear waters and panoramic Himalayan views. It is a popular 3-4 day moderate trek from Manali (via Gulaba) known for lush green expansive alpine meadows and being sacred to Maharishi Bhrigu.

JOGNI WATERFALL



Jogini Falls is a spectacular natural waterfall near Manali Himachal Pradesh located roughly 2.5 km from Vashisht Village. Known for its scenic 150-foot drop and sacred peaceful atmosphere the site is accessed via a popular easy-to-moderate 1-2 hour trek from Vashisht offering stunning views of apple orchards and the Beas River valley.

VASHISHT HOT WATER SPRING



Vashisht Hot Water Springs are natural sulphur-rich geothermal springs located in Vashisht village ~3 km from Manali. Situated within a 4,000-year-old temple complex dedicated to Sage Vashisht. The springs feature separate rustic and free bathing tanks for men and women with water temperatures ranging from 43-50°C (109-122°F).

SOLANG VALLEY



Solang Valley located 14 km northwest of Manali in Himachal Pradesh at ~2,560 meters is a premier adventure destination famous for its scenic snow-capped peaks and valley views. Known as a hotspot for skiing (Dec–Feb) and summer activities like paragliding and zorbing, it is easily accessible by road.

RAHALA FALLS



Rahala Falls is a scenic waterfall in Himachal Pradesh located around 16–27 km from Manali on the Leh–Manali Highway toward Rohtang Pass. Situated at roughly 8,500 ft (2,500 m) it is fed by melting glaciers, featuring ice-cold water, dense deodar forests and a popular spot for nature photography.

ATAL TUNNEL



The Atal Tunnel is a 9.02 km bi-lane horseshoe-shaped highway tunnel located in Himachal Pradesh India connecting Manali to the Lahaul-Spiti valley under the Rohtang Pass. Inaugurated on October 3, 2020. it is the world's longest highway tunnel above 10,000 feet (meters).

ROHTANG PASS



Rohtang Pass is a high-altitude mountain pass () on the eastern Pir Panjal Range, located about 51 km from Manali on the Leh-Manali highway. Open from May to October it connects the humid Kullu Valley with the arid Lahaul and Spiti Valleys acting as a gateway to Leh. It is famous for year-round snow, skiing, paragliding and requires a permit for crossing.

KOKSAR



Koksar is a remote village in Himachal Pradesh's Lahaul-Spiti district known as the coldest place in the Lahaul valley. Situated on the banks of the Chandra River and close to the Atal Tunnel's north portal it acts as a dramatic gateway to the region offering rugged Himalayan scenery, trekking and trout fishing.

SISSU



Sissu also known as Khwaling is a picturesque village in Himachal Pradesh's Lahaul valley located 3120 meters above sea level. Located along the Chandra River near the Atal Tunnel. It is known for the stunning Sissu Waterfall lush green fields in summer and a popular winter snow point. Part of the Lahaul and Spiti district approximately 35–40 km from Manali taking about 1–1.5 hours via the Atal Tunnel.

HAMPTA PASS TREK



The Hampta Pass trek (14,100 ft) is a 4-6 day moderate-level crossover in Himachal Pradesh famous for contrasting green Kullu valleys with barren Lahaul landscapes. Spanning ~26-28 km, it is ideal for beginners and experienced hikers typically running from June to October. The trek usually starts from Manali passing through Chika, Balu ka Ghera, and Shia Ghoru, culminating with a visit to Chandratal Lake.
