KULLU

Kullu known as the "Valley of Gods" (Kulantpitha) is a scenic district in Himachal Pradesh, India, situated on the banks of the Beas River at an elevation of 1,230 metres. Famed for its lush greenery, pine-covered hills and apple orchards. It is a popular destination offering trekking, rafting and religious tourism along with the renowned annual Kullu Dussehra festival.

BIJLI MAHADEV TEMPLE

Bijli Mahadev Temple located at 2,460 meters near Kullu, Himachal Pradesh is an ancient Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Shiva, famous for its legend of being struck by lightning annually. The temple's lingam is said to break from lightning and is restored by priests using butter and sattu.

NAGGAR CASTLE

Naggar Castle is a 15th-century (circa 1460) medieval stone and wood mansion in Himachal Pradesh, built by Raja Sidh Singh of Kullu. Located near Manali, it is a premier example of Kathkuni architecture featuring stunning Kullu Valley views. Formerly a royal residence it now serves as a heritage hotel, museum and popular tourist spot.



RAGHUNATH TEMPLE

The Raghunath Temple in Kullu, Himachal Pradesh, is a historic 17th-century Hindu temple dedicated to Lord Ram built in 1660 by Raja Jagat Singh. Situated in Sultanpur. It serves as the chief deity of the Kullu Valley and is the epicenter of the famous annual Kullu Dussehra festival.



BAGESHWAR MAHADEV TEMPLE

Basheshwar Mahadev Temple (also known as Bishweshwar Mahadev) in Bajaura, Kullu is a 9th-century stone carved protected monument of national importance. Located by the Beas River, it is the largest Shiva temple in the Kullu Valley renowned for its intricate architecture, large Yoni-Lingam and stunning stone sculptures





BHIRGU LAKE

Bhrigu Lake located in the Kullu district of Himachal Pradesh at an altitude of approximately 4,235–4,300 meters. It is a sacred glacial lake famous for its stunning year round water and surrounding snow capped peaks. Named after Maharishi Bhrigu. It is a popular high-altitude trek accessible via Gulaba village or Vashisht temple.



RAISON

Raison is a serene, offbeat hamlet on the banks of the Beas River, located about 12-14 km north of Kullu on the Kullu-Manali highway. Famed for its extensive riverside camping, Apple orchards, and scenic beauty. It is a key spot for white-water rafting, hiking and rural tourism offering a quieter alternative to busy nearby towns.



PANDOY DAM

The Pandoh Dam is a 76-meter-high embankment dam on the Beas River in Mandi district Himachal Pradesh, completed in 1977. It primarily serves the 990 MW Dehar Power House by diverting water via tunnels to the Sutlej River. The resulting Pandoh Lake offers scenic lush green, hilly views along the Kullu-Manali highway making it a popular free entry stopover for photography and picnics, often frequented from 6 AM to 6 PM.

DECHEN CHOEKHOR MAHAVIHARA MONASTERY

Dechen Choekhor Mahavihara located in Sarabai Village near Kullu (14 km from Kullu bus stand), is the mother monastery of the Drukpa Kargyu lineage. Reopened in 2017. This serene hilltop monastery is renowned for its, vibrant Indo-Tibetan architecture, breathtaking Beas Valley views and a massive 31-foot Buddha statue.





TRANQUIL PARVATI VALLEY

Parvati Valley in Kullu Himachal Pradesh, is a tranquil scenic destination known for its lush green landscapes. The flowing Parvati River and a laid back hippie culture. Famous for treks like Kheerganga and Tosh. It offers a serene mountain escape charming villages like Kasol and Kalga and spiritual sites like Manikaran.
