

TRAVEL PLAN TO MUSSOORIE

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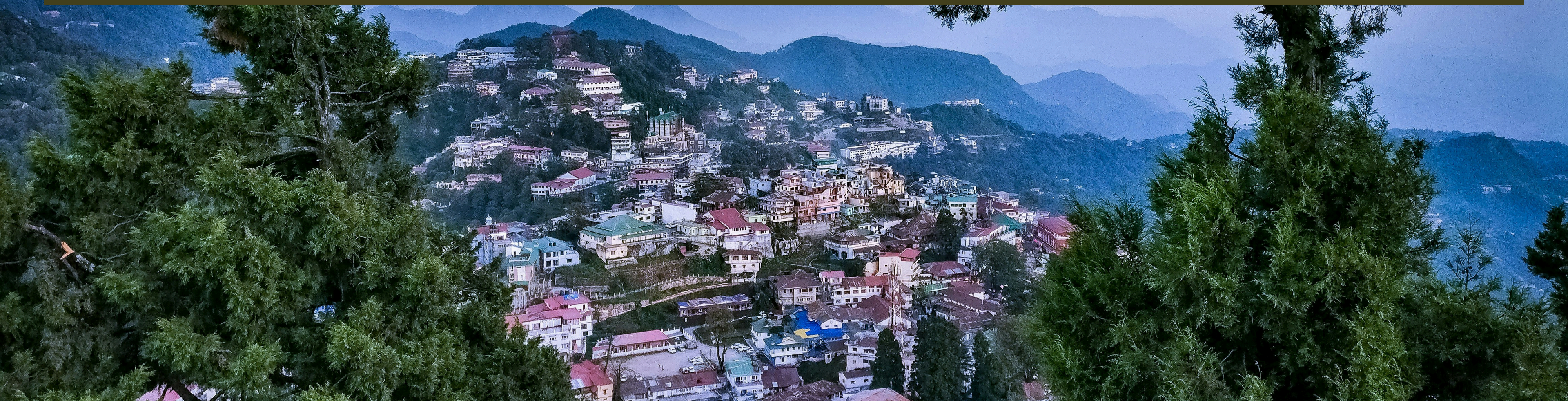
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MUSSOORIE

Mussoorie, known as the "Queen of the Hills," is a popular British era hill station in Uttarakhand, India, located at 2,000 meters in the Himalayan foothills. It is famous for its panoramic views of the Doon Valley, pleasant summers, the unique "winterline" phenomenon and key attractions like Mall Road, Gun Hill and Kempty Falls.

KEMPTY FALLS

Kempty Falls, located 13 km from Mussoorie in Uttarakhand, is a popular 40 foot waterfall cascade nestled in lush green hills, perfect for picnics and bathing. Situated at 4,500 ft, it is open daily from 8 AM to 5 PM, offering visitors a scenic spot with nearby restaurants and a cable car.



GUN HILL POINT

Gun Hill in Mussoorie is the city's second highest peak (over 2,024 m), offering 360 degree panoramic views of the Himalayan ranges including Bunderpunch and Gangotri along with the Doon Valley. Located 400 ft above Mall Road, it is a popular spot reachable by a 20-minute trek or a 400m ropeway ride.





THE MALL ROAD

The Mall Road in Mussoorie is the bustling, 2.5 kilometer heart of the hill station, connecting Library Point to Picture Palace. Located over 2,000 meters high, it offers colonial charm, panoramic Doon Valley views and a vibrant hub for shopping (woollens, handicrafts), dining and strolling.



LAL TIBBA SCENIC POINT

Lal Tibba, located in Landour near Mussoorie is the highest point in the area at 2,275 meters (7,464 feet), renowned for panoramic Himalayan views and stunning sunrises. It offers a telescope installed in 1967 to view peaks like Badrinath and Kedarnath. Located 6 km from Mall Road, it offers a peaceful less commercialized experience with cafe services.

COMPANY GARDEN



The Company Garden (or Municipal Garden) in Mussoorie is a beautifully maintained British era botanical garden located about 3 km from Mall Road. It offers colorful flower beds, an artificial waterfall, a small boating lake, a children's amusement park and panoramic views of the Himalayas, making it a popular family spot.

GEORGE EVEREST'S HOUSE



George Everest's House also known as The Park Estate, is a 19th-century colonial heritage site located about 6 km from Mussoorie's Gandhi Chowk. Built in 1832, it served as the residence, observatory and laboratory of Sir George Everest, the British Surveyor General of India who accurately measured the peak that would later be named Mount Everest in his honour.



CLOUD'S END

Cloud's End is the westernmost tip of Mussoorie, located approximately 6 to 7 km from the main town center near Library Chowk. True to its name, it marks the geographical boundary of the hill station and is celebrated for its serene, "above the clouds" atmosphere, offering a quiet alternative to the bustling Mall Road.



LANDOUR BAZAAR AND TRAILS

Landour a serene cantonment town near Mussoorie, is a quiet, British-era retreat protected since 1924, offering pristine nature walks, colonial architecture and stunning Himalayan views. Key attractions include the historic Char Dukkan, Sister's Bazaar and scenic trails like Lal Tibba, providing a peaceful escape from busy Mussoorie.





DALAI HILLS

Dalai Hills in Mussoorie is a serene scenic spot near Happy Valley known for its panoramic Himalayan views, vibrant Buddhist prayer flags and a prominent Lord Buddha statue. Located near the Shedup Choephelling Temple, it offers a peaceful escape featuring a short 400-meter hike ideal for nature lovers seeking calm away from the main town.



CAMEL'S BACK ROAD

Camel's Back Road in Mussoorie is a 3-4 km long, peaceful stretch known for its natural rock formation resembling a camel's hump. Connecting Kulri Bazar to Library Point, this quiet road is popular for walking, horse riding and viewing sunrises/sunsets with panoramic views of the Himalayas and Doon Valley.



BHATTA FALLS

Bhatta Falls is a scenic natural waterfall and popular picnic spot located approximately 7-10 km from Mussoorie on the Mussoorie-Dehradun Road. Unlike the more famous Kempty Falls, Bhatta Falls is often described as less commercialised and more peaceful, making it a preferred getaway for families and nature lovers.
