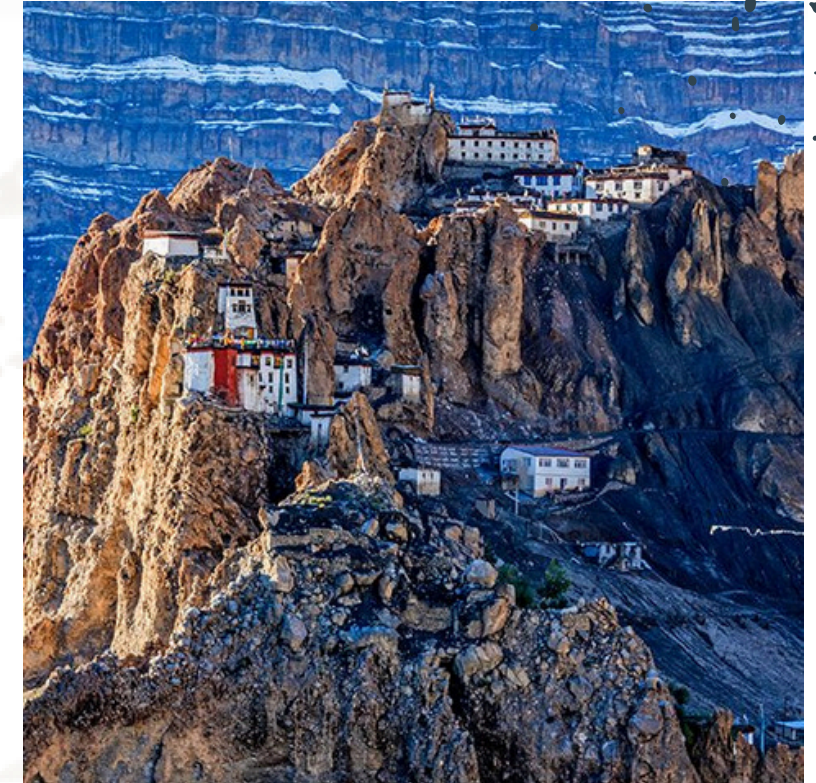
SPITI VALLEY

Spiti Valley is a high-altitude cold desert mountain valley located in the northeastern Himalayas of Himachal Pradesh, India. Known as "The Middle Land" (situated between India and Tibet), it is renowned for its rugged, breathtaking landscapes, ancient Buddhist monasteries and adventure activities like trekking, camping and stargazing.

CHANDRATAL LAKE

Chandratal Lake or "Lake of the Moon" is a stunning high-altitude freshwater lake at 14,100 feet in the Lahaul and Spiti district of Himachal Pradesh, India. Famed for its crescent shape and changing colors—from turquoise to emerald green. It is a popular trekking destination near the Kunzum Pass.

KEY MONASTERY(KEE GOMPA)

Key Monastery (Kee Gompa) is a renowned 11th-century Tibetan Buddhist monastery in Spiti Valley, Himachal Pradesh, located at 4,166 meters (13,668 ft). As the largest monastery in the region, it is known for its fortress-like architecture, ancient murals, valuable Thangkas and as a training center for Lama. It is a serene hub for Buddhist culture and Tibetan studies.





LANGZA VILLAGE

Langza, located in Himachal Pradesh's Spiti Valley at roughly 14,500 feet. It is a renowned high-altitude "fossil village" known for its ancient marine fossils (ammonites) and a massive iconic Buddha statue overlooking the valley. It offers panoramic views of the Chau Chau Kang Nilda peak featuring traditional mud houses, stunning stargazing opportunities and a tranquil, remote atmosphere.



HIKKIM VILLAGE (POST OFFICE)

Hikkim is a remote high-altitude village in Himachal Pradesh's Spiti Valley, located at approximately 4,400 meters (14,400+ feet). Renowned for housing the world's highest post office (PIN: 172114). It offers visitors a chance to send postcards from the "top of the world". The village features traditional, rustic stone houses and offers panoramic views of the Himalayas.



KIBBER & CHICHAM BRIDGE

Chicham Bridge, located in Himachal Pradesh's Spiti Valley at an altitude of approximately 13,596 feet (4,150 m), is the highest suspension bridge in Asia. It connects the remote villages of Chicham and Kibber, significantly reducing travel time over the steep Parilungbo Canyon and offering stunning views of the surrounding mountainous terrain.



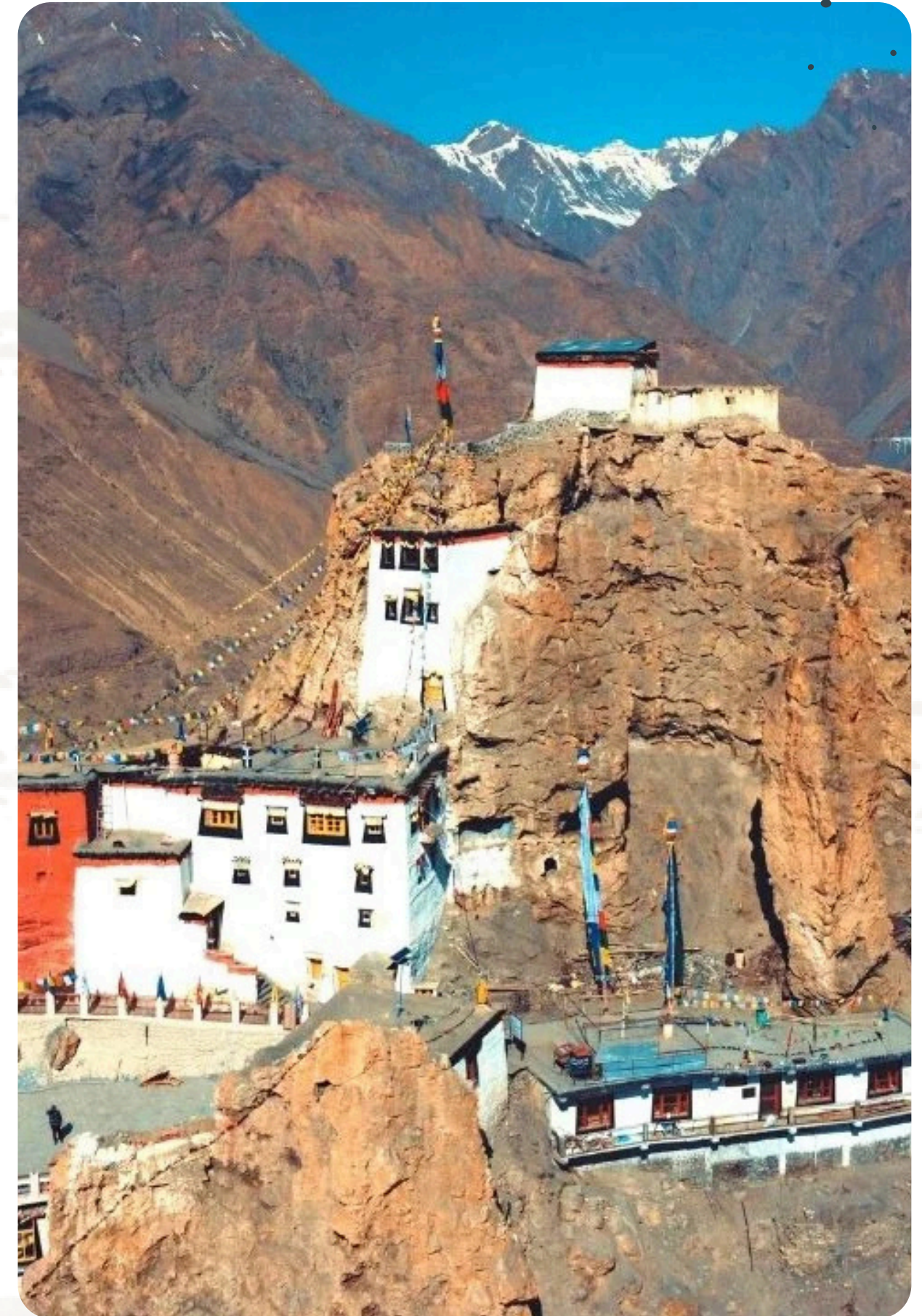


TABO MONASTERY

Tabo Monastery, founded in 996 A.D. in Himachal Pradesh's Spiti Valley, is the oldest continuously functioning Buddhist monastery in India and a UNESCO World Heritage tentative site. Known as the "Ajanta of the Himalayas," it features ancient frescoes, thangkas and mud-brick stucco statues.

DHANKAR MONASTERY & LAKE

Dhankar Monastery is a 1,000-year-old Buddhist temple perched precariously on a 300-meter cliff in Spiti Valley, Himachal Pradesh, overlooking the Spiti and Pin River confluence. Formerly a fort and prison, this Gelug school monastery houses ancient murals, scriptures, and a Dhyana Buddha statue. A 2 km, 1-2 hour uphill hike from the monastery leads to the serene, high-altitude Dhankar Lake.





KUNZUM PASS

Kunzum Pass (Kunzum La) is a high-altitude mountain pass in Himachal Pradesh, India. Connecting the Lahaul and Spiti valleys at 4,551 meters (14,931 feet). Known for its 15 hairpin turns and breathtaking views of the Bara-Sigri glacier. It is a popular summer, adventure destination (June–October) for bikers, trekkers and tourists.



GUE VILLAGE

Gue (or Giu) is a remote, high-altitude village in Himachal Pradesh's Spiti Valley, near the India-China border, renowned for its 500-600 year old naturally preserved mummy of a Buddhist monk, Sangha Tenzin. Located ~10,000 feet up, this small village features the mummy in a glass container inside a local monastery, preserving teeth and hair, showcasing a unique blend of spirituality and deep history.

KAZA

Kaza is the high-altitude administrative capital of Spiti Valley in Himachal Pradesh, situated at ~12,500 ft on the Spiti River bank. As the largest town in the valley, it acts as a central hub for exploring "Little Tibet," renowned for ancient monasteries, rugged Himalayan landscapes and adventure sports, operating as a crucial tourist base camp.
