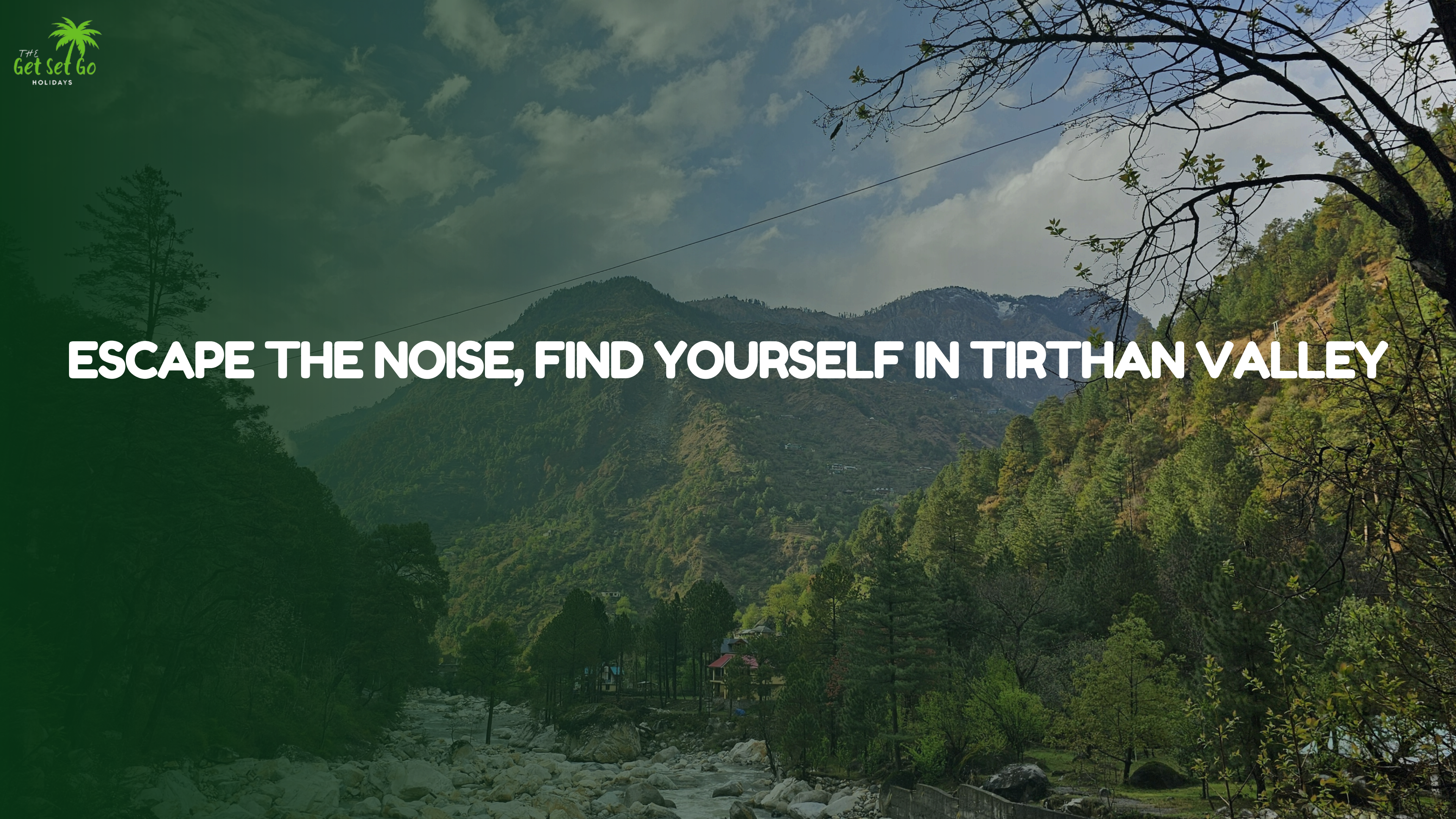


TRAVEL PLAN TO TIRTHAN VALLEY

TIRTHAN VALLEY

Tirthan Valley, located in Himachal Pradesh's Kullu district at 1600m, is a pristine, eco-tourism destination along the Tirthan River. It is a serene alternative to crowded hill stations, famous for trout fishing, trekking in the Great Himalayan National Park, riverside camping, and exploring villages like Gushaini, making it ideal for nature lovers.

GREAT HIMALAYAN NATIONAL PARK

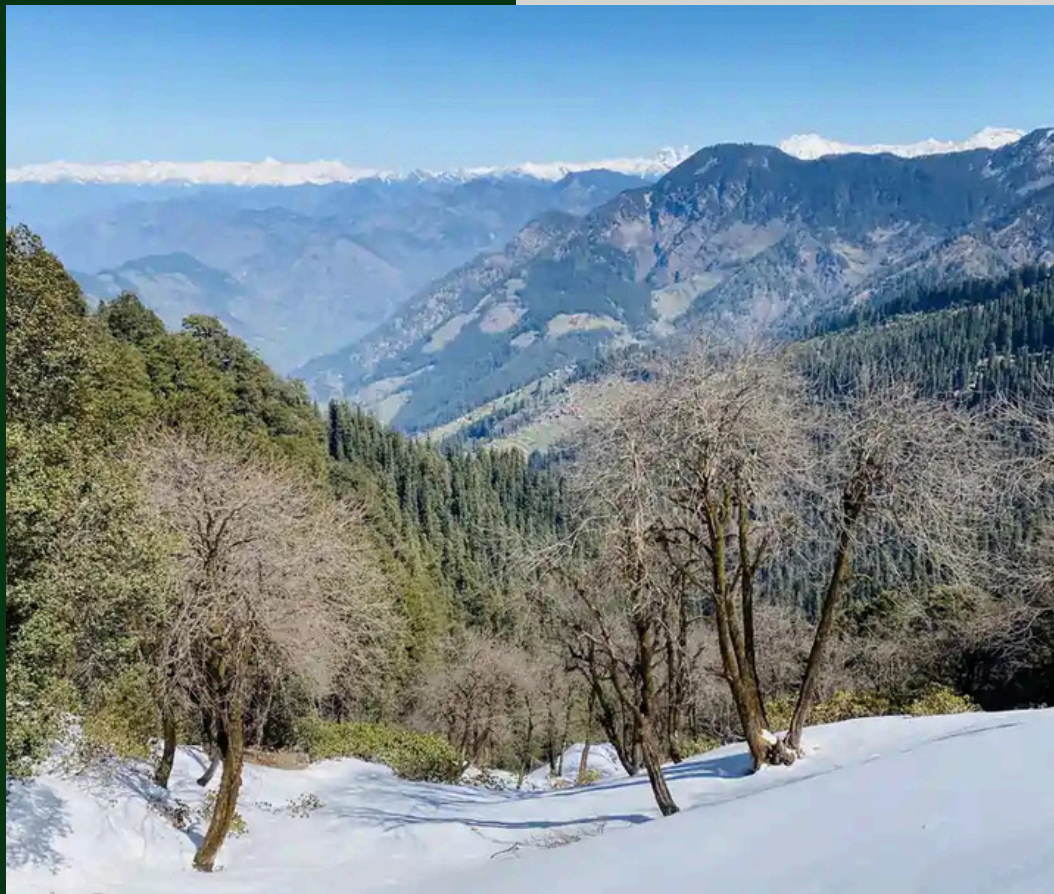
The Great Himalayan National Park (GHNP) in Tirthan Valley, Himachal Pradesh, is a UNESCO World Heritage Site (listed 2014) renowned for its high biodiversity and pristine ecosystem. Located in the Kullu district, it offers trekking, trout fishing and nature therapy amid scenic forests and is home to rare wildlife like snow leopards and Himalayan tahrs.





JIBHI

Jibhi is a serene offbeat hamlet in Himachal Pradesh's Tirthan Valley (Kullu district) known for lush pine forests, pristine rivers and traditional wooden architecture at an altitude of 2,250m. Ideal for nature lovers and adventurers, popular spots include Jibhi Waterfall, Jalori Pass, and Serolsar Lake.



JALORI PASS

Jalori Pass is a high-altitude mountain pass in Himachal Pradesh's Tirthan Valley, rising to approximately 3,120 meters (10,236 ft). Known for panoramic Himalayan views, it offers steep trekking, dense forests and is a popular adventure destination near Jibhi. Best visited April-June or September-October; it is often blocked by snow in winter.

SEROLSAR LAKE

Serolsar Lake is a stunning high-altitude lake located at 3,100 meters in Himachal Pradesh's Tirthan Valley known for its crystal-clear water and surrounding dense oak forests. Accessed via a popular 5 km trek from Jalori Pass, this tranquil, sacred spot is dedicated to Budhi Nagin the mother of all snake deities.



CHHOIE WATERFALL

Chhoie Waterfall is a stunning, roughly 100-foot waterfall located in the Tirthan Valley of Himachal Pradesh reached via a short moderately challenging 1-hour trek (approx. 2-3 km) from Village Nagini. Known for its pristine crystal-clear water and peaceful lush green surroundings. This hidden gem is considered a sacred spot by locals, offering a refreshing nature escape.



RAGHUPUR FORT

Raghupur Fort is a scenic, ruined hilltop fort near Jalori Pass in Tirthan Valley (3,500m+), known for panoramic 360-degree Himalayan views. Accessible via a 3km moderate trek from Jalori Pass through oak forests, it offers a peaceful meadow, ruins of old walls, and a small pond.



SHRINGA RISHI TEMPLE

The Shringa Rishi Temple, located in Baggi village near Banjar in Himachal Pradesh's Tirthan Valley, is a revered sanctuary dedicated to the sage Shringa Rishi. As the ruling deity of the Banjar Valley, the temple features intricate traditional Kath-Kuni (wood and stone) architecture and is a key spiritual site.



TIRTHAN RIVER

The Tirthan River is a pristine, crystal-clear waterway originating from the Hanskund glaciers in Himachal Pradesh's Great Himalayan National Park (GHNP). It flows through the tranquil Tirthan Valley (approx. 1,600m altitude). A {"hidden gem"} known for trout fishing, eco-tourism and trekking near Kullu. The river merges with the Beas at Larji.



BUDHI NAGIN TEMPLE

The Mata Budhi Nagin Temple is a revered shrine located beside the pristine Serolsar Lake near Jalori Pass in Tirthan Valley, Himachal Pradesh. Dedicated to the "mother of all snake deities" in the region, it is a key pilgrimage spot often reached via a 5-6 km trek from Jalori Pass, known for its serene surroundings and deep-rooted legends.
