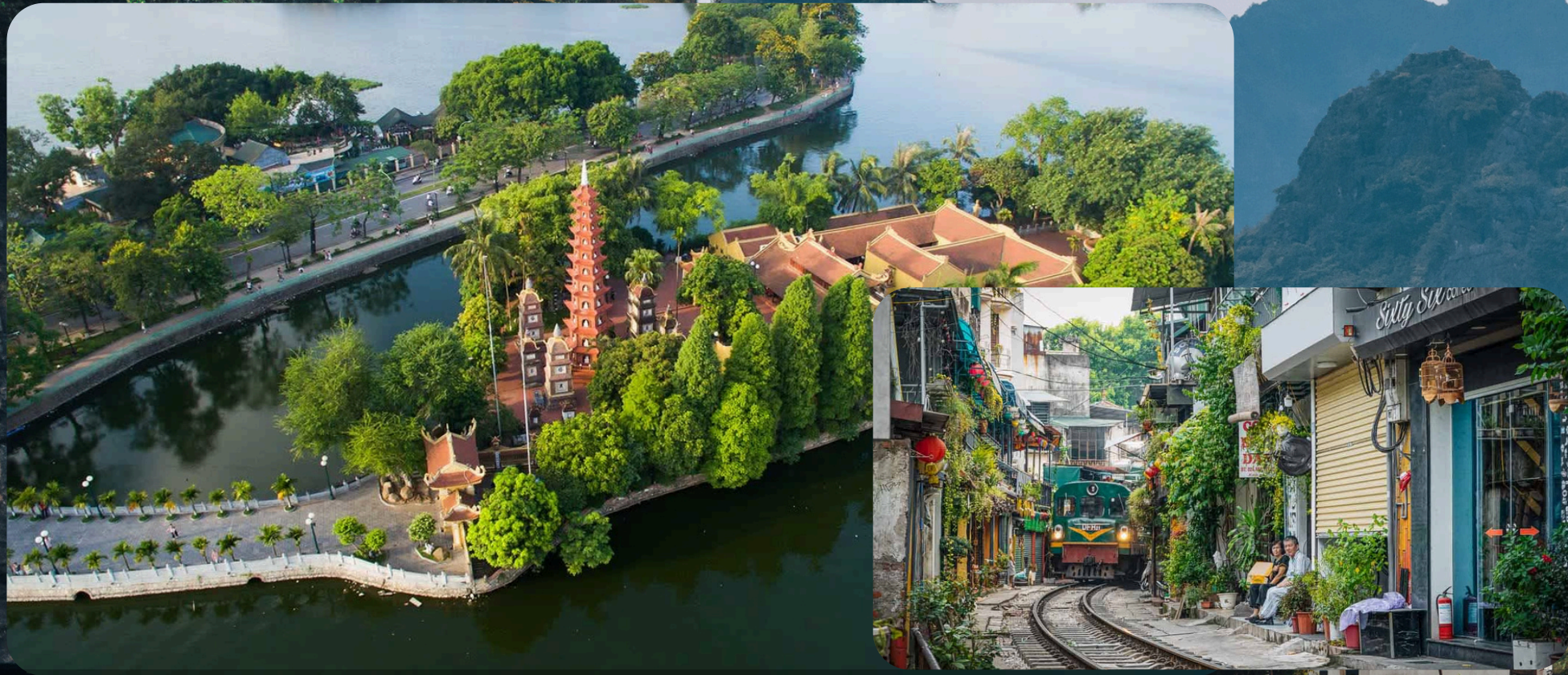

HANOI (NORTH)

Hanoi the capital of Vietnam located in the north along the Red River is a bustling, over 1,000 year old city blending Southeast Asian, Chinese and French influences. Known for its atmospheric Old Quarter, rich street food culture (pho, egg coffee) and historic landmarks like the Temple of Literature. It serves as the nation's cultural and political heart.



HO CHI MINH CITY (SOUTH)

Ho Chi Minh City (formerly Saigon) is Vietnam's largest city and financial engine, located in the South. Known for its high energy fast paced atmosphere. It blends French colonial architecture with modern skyscrapers like Landmark 81. It is a tourism hub offering historic sites, vibrant street food and bustling markets with a tropical climate.



HOI AN (CENTRAL)

Hoi An located on Vietnam's central coast is a beautifully preserved UNESCO World Heritage site known as the "city of lanterns". Famous for its mix of traditional wooden houses, Chinese assembly halls and the iconic Japanese Covered Bridge. It offers a charming glimpse into a 15th century trading port.

HUE (CENTRAL)

Hue located in Central Vietnam along the Perfume River is the nation's former imperial capital (1802–1945) and a UNESCO World Heritage site known for its rich Nguyen Dynasty history. Key attractions include the massive Imperial City, royal tombs and Thien Mu Pagoda. best visited between February and April.



DA NANG (CENTRAL)

Da Nang is a premier modern coastal city in Central Vietnam renowned as a highly livable destination offering a mix of sandy beaches (like My Khe) iconic bridges (Dragon Bridge) and close proximity to UNESCO sites like Hoi An. It acts as a major tourism hub, boasting luxury resorts, vibrant nightlife and a tropical monsoon climate.



HA LONG BAY / LAN HA BAY

Ha Long Bay (Quang Ninh Province) and Lan Ha Bay (Hai Phong/Cat Ba Island) are UNESCO recognized natural wonders in Northern Vietnam famous for thousands of limestone karsts rising from emerald waters. Ha Long is renowned for iconic, massive caves (like Sung Sot) and intense tourist popularity, while neighboring Lan Ha offers a quieter, more pristine experience often favored for swimming and kayaking.



NINH BINH (TRANG AN / TAM COC)

Ninh Binh often called "Inland Ha Long Bay" is a stunning region in North Vietnam renowned for dramatic limestone karsts, winding rivers and lush rice paddies. Key attractions include the UNESCO listed Trang An Scenic Landscape Complex and the serene Tam Coc. Both areas offer boat tours.



SAPA (NORTH)

Sapa is a mountainous town in northwest Vietnam's Lào Cai province renowned for its dramatic rice terraces, Fansipan mountain (3,143m) and vibrant ethnic minority cultures. Located about 250km from Hanoi. This former French colonial hill station serves as a trekking hub for exploring the Hoang Lien Son range, Muong Hoa Valley and villages like Cat Cat.



PHONG NHA -KE BANG NATIONAL PARK (CENTRAL)

The second of Vietnam's two natural World Heritage Sites Phong Nha National Park covers a huge area of 857 square kilometers (85,754 ha) and is noted for its incredible geological diversity including the world's largest cave, the world's longest underground river and the world's largest cave pearls.



PHU QUOC (SOUTH)

Southern Phu Quoc in Vietnam is a premier tropical destination featuring stunning white sand beaches like Bai Sao and Khem Beach high end resorts and the world's longest sea crossing cable car to Hon Thom Island. It is known for its turquoise waters, snorkeling in the An Thoi Archipelago and cultural spots like Ho Quoc Pagoda, Coconut Tree Prison and Sunset Town.



NHA TRANG

Nha Trang is a vibrant coastal city in South Central Vietnam, renowned as the country's beach capital featuring a 7km sandy beach, lively nightlife and year round sunshine. It is a premier spot for water sports, scuba diving, island hopping and therapeutic mud baths, blending modern high rise city life with natural beauty.



QUY NHON

Quy Nhon is a tranquil underrated coastal city in central Vietnam recognized for its stunning less crowded beaches like Ky Co and pristine islands. Situated between Nha Trang and Hoi An. It offers a blend of relaxation, ancient Champa towers, fresh seafood and rich local culture often called the "Maldives of Vietnam".
